The year 2008 has begun with some changes both at Uni and at your UniHi Education Foundation. First of all, Eric Davidson has replaced Elois McGehee as Principal. Eric comes to us from Westchester High and brings a world of enthusiasm with him. Eric coordinated the Accreditation process at Westchester, acted as the liaison with Loyola Marymount in the partnership and supervised the Math Department. Welcome Eric!!! Elois is moving up and becoming a section administrator within LAUSD. We know that these moves will be positive not only for Eric & Elois but also for the School and the Foundation.

Additionally, our beloved Carolyn Sausser Lynch S'49 has resigned her duties at the Foundation. She has put her heart and soul into the Foundation for the past decade and for that all of us are very grateful. The Foundation is a small core of people with a lot to do. We can always use additional help. We hold our monthly meetings the last Wednesday of every month in Brentwood in the evening. When you come to the picnic look for any of the UHEF board members. We would love to meet you.

On the finance side, The Foundation gave in excess of the donations received in the fiscal year just ended. We were able to do this because of prior major donations from a very special anonymous donor. Those funds helped us purchase and install the 10 computers for the career center at a cost of over \$12,000. We spent over \$8,000 for a new book security system for the library. \$2,500 went for supplemental funding of the Drama/Performing Arts program. In the box on page 3 you can see a more detailed breakdown of the programs your donations have supported this past fiscal year. We are counting on you and your continued support in the coming year.

After much consideration the UHEF Board has decided to contract with Harris Publishing to publish a new alumni directory. It's been ten years since this was last done and updating our database with current information will be beneficial to all. Mike Johnson S'60 is in charge of this project and we very much appreciate his effort.

This year the All Alumni Annual Picnic and Car Show Fundraiser will be held Sunday, September 28th from 12-4 on the upper field. Bring your friends and make new ones as well. Last year we had some absolutely amazing cars and this years' event looks to be even better. We are taking a new approach and suggesting a \$10 donation per car. This money will go directly to the school and will help ease the continuing budget crisis that the school is facing. Let's all be generous!!

THE ALUMNI DIRECTORY 2.0

Lost your Year Book? Looking for friends from Uni that were not in your graduation year? The old Alumni Directory not working for you? Well, after much consideration the UHEF Board has decided to work again with the Harris Publishing Company to produce a new University High School All-Alumni Handbook. Ten years have elapsed since the first edition came out. That's ten years of graduations, address and other changes.

As many of you may remember the first book was far from accurate and comprehensive. In the intervening years Harris has made many changes in their approach to the project. First they will filter the existing (and rather inaccurate) information through modern search engines. Then they will contact alumni by postcard to verify accuracy, and to get permission to publish, personal data. They send two (2) postcards, and then, if they do not hear back they attempt to contact alumni by phone. They have assured us that they will honor the Do Not Call List. You will be able to prevent your personal data from inclusion in the database if you so wish. All you have to do is respond to the postcard. To insure confidentiality no one outside of the UHEF Board will have full access to this database, and that includes the people at Harris.

You can opt out of the entire project if you wish. Either let us know that you do not want to be contacted when you return your UHEF membership form or let Harris know when you reply to them. The only information in the book will be your name in the graduating class list.

FROM PRINCIPAL DAVIDSON'S DESK

ERIC DAVIDSON

My name is Eric Davidson and I would like to introduce myself as the new Principal at University High School. It is a privilege to serve a school with such a rich and honored tradition. It is a tradition that one can sense when you enter the door. It is a tradition where notoriety and accomplishment are not the exception, but the rule. It is a tradition that we intend on maintaining as we continue our journey into the future. I thank the current faculty, staff, and community members for their sincere welcome and on-going support as our school community continues to implement innovative programs and structures that are sure to sustain the academic and social growth of all Wildcats.

One of the key elements of University High School that separates it from other schools is the sense of family. Family is important to me. I share my life with a wife, Gloria, and two fine young citizens, Lindsey and Tyler. Lindsey will be graduating a year from now at Gonzaga University. Tyler is graduating from Westchester High School this spring and will attend Loyola Marymount University in the fall. I take pride in my family and in my new family.

I come to University from Westchester High School where I served as an Assistant Principal for four years. I attended Westchester as a high school senior after moving to Los Angeles with my family in 1974. I attended Loyola Marymount University and earned a degree in Communication Arts. I soon found my way to Los Angeles Unified School District. I received a teaching credential from LMU and later completed the graduate program with a Masters degree in Education and an Administrative credential. It is at LMU that I learned to appreciate the value of diversity and social justice. I apply those values to the work I do today at University.

I joined University knowing there are great changes in store. The 2008 school year will open with an alternate schedule similar to the Copernican schedule that was employed by the school through much of the 1990s. The school will also be implementing two Small Learning Communities (SLC): The Academy of Engineering and The Digital and Multimedia Academy. Over the next several years, we will also include a Renaissance Academy, a Health Science and Sports Medicine Academy, and a Business, Law, and International Studies Academy. These academies are designed to provide students with pathways to college and careers after high school. SLC include strategies that personalize learning, provide equitable access and opportunity for every student, and make the result of learning both real and relevant.

University High School is also in the middle of a seismic mitigation project that will remove several temporary buildings, the music rooms and the west gym. The district will be constructing a new gym, replacing the music rooms, and upgrading other parts of the facility. We will also be entering into a joint use project with the Westside YMCA. The new facilities will provide an on-site swimming pool, practice gyms, and outdoor surfaces for tennis and basketball. We anticipate a long and mutually beneficial partnership with the YMCA.

Think about joining us at Uni for Career Day or come visit campus when we have open house tours on most Thursday mornings. Come see our progress.

I would conclude with the idea that all Wildcats need to learn to live and live to learn. Our future is defined by our effort to be inclusive, our wisdom in our choices, and our resolve to positively impact the world in which we live. In gratitude and with respect.

HOOPSTERS HISTORIC APPEARANCE



We don't know whether or not it is a first for Uni, but this past March **both** the Boys' and Girls' basketball teams – the Uni Wildcats - reached the L.A. City Invitational Basketball championship finals at the Sports Arena. Both final games were televised.

Coached by Steve Ackerman, Uni '89, the boys concluded a 22-12 season by beating Eagle Rock 48-41 and winning the championship. This was a first for the 10 seniors on the team.

The Girls' team, coached by Roger Kiyomura, ended their 16-13 season by decisively defeating Dorsey (60-46), Bell (56-44) and Gardena (48-31) to reach the final game against El Camino Real. They were edged out at the end of the game 42-48.

These games followed a football season when the Wildcats were defeated by Garfield High School, a traditional City powerhouse, in the City Invitational finals at the Coliseum. Elois McGeehee wrote: "It was a great going away gift for me because they played those championship games on the Saturday after my last day at Uni. ONE OF OUR OWN CAROLYN SAUSSER LYNCH: SUMMER 1949

Carolyn Sausser Lynch, the dynamic voice of the Uni Hi Education Foundation, has retired from the Board of Directors. What began as a, "what can I do to help?" question in 1999, evolved into nine years of dedicated service. Her organizational skills and personal commitment involved her in every aspect of the Foundation, including fundraising and distribution of funds, the newsletter, and organizing the yearly Alumni picnic.

For those who have never met Carolyn, she is a true Daughter of the Hills of Westwood. Raised near Pico on Selby in the shadow of the Apple Pan, Carolyn has seen the Westside change from miles of rural truck farms (she remembers watching tractors and horse drawn plows work the farmlands south of Pico) to the modern, frenetic community it is today.

According to Carolyn, times were simpler, and life was less stressful growing up in her idyllic neighborhood in the 30's and 40's. Those were some of the happiest and rewarding times of her life. There were many vacant lots to build forts, sidewalks for roller-skating, and an empty garage where she and her girlfriends could play dolls and "dress-up." A nearby pony ride concession on Pico was a very popular attraction for these Depression Era kids. And, during World War II, an anti-aircraft battery located within blocks of her home, added a sense of excitement to the neighborhood. But Carolyn also remembers the sad times—one of them being when several of her and her younger brother's friends were carted off to the Interment Camps at the start of World War II.

After graduating from Westwood Elementary, Carolyn's next stop was Emerson Junior High School where she had her first taste of Student Government and community service. It was the beginning of a life long commitment to help others—especially children.

Westwood was in walking distance and the Saturday matinees at the Village and Bruin were the order of the day. Carolyn's favorites were musicals and comedies—especially the Hope-Crosby Road pictures. Afterwards, a visit to Albert Sheets for a very special ice cream treat completed the outing for her and her friends. "Tom Crumplars was off limits—too rowdy for my mother's tastes," Carolyn muses with a chuckle.

Summer time was beach time, and the Santa Monica Blvd. bus was the method of getting there. Roadside Rest Beach and Neenie's Famous Weenies were two of the more popular spots.

Although most of Carolyn's days at Uni were spent studying, she loved the campus and found time to participate in many student council activities, and service groups: Girl's League, Class Governance, the Mawanda's, the Meledonians and was a Sealbearer at graduation.

After graduating from Uni, Carolyn spent two enjoyable years at Stanford. It was her first time away from home and she discovered the joys of independence. She transferred to UCLA, got married, and began to raise a family. Having children had always been a lifelong dream, and over the years, her four children became the main focus of her life. Her time with them was very precious and she remembers with fondness all of the activities they shared together. Another one of her favorite activities was with the Westwood Hills Woman's Club Juniors who worked with the Marion Davies Clinic for children. When the clinic became part of the UCLA Medical Center, Carolyn worked in the volunteer program.

Solid careers in several bond and brokerage firms honed her business and people skills. With her children grown, she also had time to pursue her hobbies: Restoration of vintage homes, and her first love, gardening.

And, it was Carolyn's genuine love for Uni Hi and her desire to help that led her to that small cubbyhole of a room on campus that was the home of the Uni Alumni Office. Because Carolyn had a computer she could help organize the files that had been kept--up to that time--by hand. She enjoyed meeting people and the challenges of the daily workings of the Foundation. So, it was only natural that over the years, she began to accept more and more responsibilities within the Foundation.




