The past academic year saw significant change in the make-up of the Uni High Education Foundation board. Mike Cockinos '68, UHEF President since 2006, announced his decision to step down due to work and time demands. Mike's time and generous financial support of Uni have been wonderful and we will miss his enthusiasm at meetings and know that he'll try to come to the All-Alumni Picnic and Car Show on September 30. We all thank you, Mike.

In response to Mike vacating the presidency, two of us, Ivan Finkle '50 and Judy Wolfenstein, past president, stepped in. We have had the pleasure of presiding at board meetings with active board membership of some of the wonderful parents of current students. For the first time in many years, thanks to the vision of Principal Davidson and the enthusiasm of the parents of student athletes and all those who believe in Uni, our board more accurately represents Uni's community. Profiles of UHEF officers are in this Newsletter.

The Annual Newsletter has been our single largest source for fundraising, but it also accounts for the largest outlay of dollars. We mail the Newsletter to the entire list of roughly 14,000 names in our database, and get roughly a $2.6 \%$ response. As such mailings go, that is considered a good return. BUT, we're spending a lot of money that should be going straight to the school, not for printing and mailing.

Recent LAUSD actions have threatened the continuity of Uni's performing arts program, and the UHEF is trying to help keep it going. We are also faced with severe budget cuts that will make sustaining vital student programs nearly impossible.

Evidence is strong for our academic achievement. This year, students have been accepted to Harvard, Brown, UCLA and Berkeley. Our first cadre of students graduated from the School of Engineering, led by Jeff Ricards. Our Business and Finance School, led by Steve Clotzman, organized a wonderful Career Day in partnership with the Westwood Village Rotary Club. The School of Communication Arts features award winning students guided by teachers, Olga Kokino and Dana Coonen-Lee. Kerri Eich, Director of the School of Health and Environmental Science sponsored an annual Health Fair that is supported by dozens of community and governmental agencies. Through the efforts of Nathalie Cunningham, Director of our Theatre Arts Program, Uni won the national SMASH contest. Along with the recognition, the school will receive technical support and professional coaching for future theatre students. New lights are not the only building project that will vitalize the campus in the next few years. We anticipate completion of a new tennis courts and outdoor basketball courts, and planning is in the works for a 'synthetic' track and field to be completed by the fall of 2014. Our music program, directed by Art Shane, will have a new instrumental and vocal room facility in use by December 2012. The main building will begin an air conditioning project within the next six months.

So far, we have received $\$ 5012.00$ for the track renovation fund. Your donations combined with the $\$ 25,000$ committed by UHEF make a total of $\$ 29,012$. Our goal is a million dollars.

This past year the UHEF made the following allocations to support the University High School community totaling $\mathbf{\$ 2 0 , 2 5 0}$.

- The Athletic Trust - $\$ 4,750$ for a portion of the protective floor covering for the new gym
- The Peer Mediation Program - $\$ 3,000$
- The Drama Trust for the spring musical, Godspell -\$5,500
- The Art Department - \$3,000 for supplies
- The Football Trust - $\$ 4,000$ matching funds for the lift-a-thon

UHEF presented two \$1,000 Community Service Awards. One to Lisa Marcial-Hernandez for 1240 hours of community service, and one to Derrick Paris for 896 hours of community service.

UHEF also spent about $\$ 5,000.00$ for the annual newsletter printing, mailing, postage and stationary

## From the Halls of Uni...DRAMA is a SMASH!

Drama Teacher, Nathalie Cunningham and Music Teacher, Kahlil Sabbagh, lit up the Uni community when 2 competitions sparked a strong sense of student recognition.

In Spring 2012, Cunningham applied for a national online contest. Soon, the teachers received notice Uni had been chosen as one of the top thirty finalists from 1,000 applicants in the "SMASH" Make a Musical Initiative-Uni, the only finalist from LAUSD. After an e-blast to all of the staff of Uni and to all you alumni, voting really took off! The IT manager, Dr. Brian Johnson had all the computers he was in charge of voting every day. ALL of the tech teachers with multiple computers voted every day. One came up with a URL to make voting easy for the entire Uni community. Alumni, parents, and supportive staff, teachers, and others from local LAUSD schools voted. Ultimately, Uni won first place, with over 33,000 votes. The grand prize (free Broadway Show Kit!) included: the rights to perform a musical, master classes with iTheatrics (New York-based master teachers), a local project advisor, two teacher stipends, and a technical theater fund-valued at \$100,000.00

While GodspeII, the spring musical, was in rehearsal, another competition was announced from Pantages Theater. High schools were invited to send two student leads from their musicals, to compete. Cunningham entered "our Jesus and our Judas." Our young Jesus, Evyn Mirasol, a sophomore and the youngest competitor, won the position of first runner up, (a prize of $\$ 500$ ) and became the first female Jerry Herman Award winner in Los Angeles. She won \$1000, and a week in New York doing workshops with Broadway professionals, culminating in a big production on the Minskoff stage on Broadway. With others, Evyn has become eligible for future awards.

## UNI HIGH'S OLYMPIC TRACK HERITAGE

## Craig Dixon '44 and Mel Patton '43

Just as the Olympics are being held in London, the UHEF (Alumni and Boosters) are campaigning to raise funds for a new track at Uni. It seems appropriate to spotlight Uni High Olympians. Craig Dixon ('44) with his fellow Uni alum, Mel Patton ('43) both of whom competed in the 1948 games- also held in London. Recently, Ivan Finkle interviewed Dixon and Patton.

The headline could have read: "Uni High Wins 1949 NCAA Track Championship." In reality, three former Uni track athletes, each competing for their respective colleges totaled 43 points, enough to win the 1949 NCAA championship. Mel Patton took first in the 100 and 200 yard dashes, Craig Dixon won both high and low hurdle races, and Taylor Lewis ' 43 took fifth place in the discus.

Dixon dominated the high and low hurdles on the west coast when attending UCLA from 1946 to 1949. He ran at all of UCLA's dual meets and Relay Invitational meets and recalls the Invitational races as "the biggest I had ever run". 50,000 people watched the Coliseum Relays in Los Angeles, races preceding the 1948 Olympic trials in Evanston, Illinois.

Dixon had begun his track career at Fairburn Grammar School as a high jumper and continued his efforts at Emerson Junior High. At Uni, track coach Jim Pursell introduced him to the high hurdles where Dixon demonstrated ability. Pursell told the young man, "you are now a hurdler." In his senior year Dixon, as team captain, led Uni to its first All-City Championship. To this day Dixon can name all his teammates on that championship team, their events, and how they placed.

Dixon's time at Uni is remembered as "a growing period for me." Focused on athletics as he was, his extraathletic memories include the following:
$\star$ His favorite teacher and subject: Evander Dixon and physics. Evander, a relative determined not to show favoritism - though Dixon did well.
^ Being intimidated seated next to Norma Jean Baker.

$\star$ Waking every morning at 4:00 AM to deliver the LA Times.
$\star$ Biking to Sorrento beach on weekends.
$\star$ Tasting Tom Crumplar's great malts.
« Selling Saturday Evening Post and Liberty magazines in Westwood.
^ Coming in second in a "Hi-Li Paddle" contest and winning a whole month's pass to the Village Theater.
^ Drinking Nine-cent milk shakes at the Westwood Drug store.
$\star$ Trying to skate at Sonja Henie's Ice Palace in Westwood.
$\star$ Being elected member of the Knights at Uni.
$\star$ He was elected athletic commissioner in his senior year.

As a Bruin, Dixon was the first of the great West Coast hurdlers. He was the first person to run under 14.0 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles and he tied Jesse Owens' world record of 22.5 seconds in the 220-yard low hurdles. He held every record in both the high and low hurdles in all UCLA dual meets, as well as every record in the high hurdles in all Relay Invitational meets as well.

In 1948, his junior year, Dixon competed in the Olympic trials for the summer games in London. His entire running career was in preparation for this event, and Dixon was "euphoric" upon earning his place on the Olympic team.

Traveling to London, the entire U.S. team traveled on the USS America, the first luxury liner. We spent 7 days on the high seas where Dixon trained by running around the deck. Arriving in the United Kingdom the US athletes moved to the Olympic Village in Uxbridge. There, Dixon met other athletes from around the world. He remembers, "the foreign athletes were jealous of Americans be-
cause our food was shipped over from the U.S. and, unlike theirs, was outstanding. Marching with the American team in the opening ceremonies was incredible. I do not think I will ever be able to explain what the feeling was. There were 85,000 people in the stands at Wembley Stadium as we paraded around the track." Dixon earned the Bronze Medal in the 110-meter high hurdles in a photo finish.

The following year Dixon continued to amaze by winning four national titles: the NCAA and AAU high and low hurdles, including 59 consecutive victories in the U.S. and Europe. He was ranked number one in the world. January 1950 he was invited to participate in The Melrose Games and the New York Athletic Club Invitational at Madison Square Gardens. He won the Gold in the 60-yard high hurdles in both venues.

In 1951 Wilbur Johns, Athletic Director at UCLA, hired Dixon as the first full-time assistant track coach to Ducky Drake. He also acted as head freshman track and cross-country coach and implemented a fall track program. Dixon was the primary force in recruiting athletes who would win UCLA's first national NCAA track and field championships' in 1956. Two of Dixon's most successful recruits were Rafer Johnson and C.K. Yang.

In 1978 Dixon was given the distinguished award from the Los Angeles
 Athletic Club. In 1981, Dixon received the Los Angeles Bicentennial Sports Achievement Award as one of 200 outstanding athletes to hail from Los Ange-form. Uni grad, Craig Dixon is on the right. les. In 1984, he was chosen as the training site director for the track and field venue at UCLA Drake Stadium to prepare for the ' 84 Olympic games in Los Angeles. In 1985, Dixon was voted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame. He left coaching in 1958 to enter the advertising business where he retired from the industrial publishing division of the Dun and Bradstreet Corporation in 1987. In January of 1988 he opened his own Publishers Representative firm selling industrial advertising on the West coast. He retired in 2004. Now living in Westwood ( 5 minutes from UCLA) with his wife Jan, Dixon looks back fondly to the 1948 London games and looks forward to watching the 2012 Olympic Games in London.

Mel Patton attended Westwood School and Emerson before Uni. At Emerson, PE Teacher Turely recognized he had a fleet-footed student with a promising future. When Patton reached Uni, Coach Pursell was waiting for him.

Patton remembers coach Jim Pursll as "a wonderful coach". His training program was strict, and effective. Training left Patton only time to work weekends delivering ice for the Union Ice Company.

After Uni, Patton spent two years with the US Navy and then went to USC on the GI Bill, where he was coached by the legendary Dean Cromwell. At USC Patton won the NCAA 100 yard dash for three consecutive years, 1947, 1948, and 1949. He became known as Pell Mell and the World's Fastest Human. In 1947 he tied the world 100-yard dash record of 9.4 seconds, then lowered it to 9.3 the following year. In the 1948 Olympics he took gold in the 200-meter dash and the $4 \times 100$ relay. In 1949 Patton set a 220-yard world record on a straightaway of 20.2 seconds, breaking a record set 14 years earlier by Jesse Owens.

After competing at USC and the Olympics Patton ran a series of pro races in Australia. When his competitive days were over, Patton coached at Long Beach City College for over eight years before entering the electronics industry as the manager of the Washington office of Sanders Associates.

Dixon and Patton were able to share one more award. In 1949 Dorothy Chandler held what was to be a perpetual award, the National Sports Award. This first event was held at the Ambassador Hotel, in the famous Coconut Grove. Bob Hope was the emcee. The top award, Outstanding Track Athlete of the Country, was a tie, and was shared by Dixon and Patton. Two Uni grads!
