▶ If you're a Shakespeare connoisseur, you've undoubtedly seen all 37 of his plays. If not, Uni Director of Theatre Arts Ronnie Sperling can help correct this oversight in one night.

That's because the fall performance of the Uni Theatre Arts department will feature "The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged)," a hilarious send-up of Shakespeare's works, created in 1987 by American stage performers and writers Adam Long, Daniel Singer and Jess Winfield.

The show was an immediate hit in its initial performances at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival and ran for more than nine years at the Criterion Theatre in London.

The program starts with a romp through "Romeo and Juliet" and concludes with a bidirectional version of "Hamlet."

Confused? Don't be; just make your plans to attend one of the four performances now scheduled. All will be staged on-campus at the Stivelman Theatre, on consecutive Fridays and Saturdays on November 14-15 and 21-22.

While you're at it, mark your 2015 calendar for the spring performances of "Into The Woods," which he calls a "Broadway Musical-Faery Tale Mash-up." It's also slated for four performances, on May 8-9-15-16 of 2015.

Coach Lee Lowe's team will play all of its games on the road this season due to the renovation of Cavanagh Field and the surrounding running track now underway.

In the season opener at South Gate, Uni fell behind 21-0 before Tyrone Nelson returned a kickoff 67 yards for a touchdown. The Wildcats trailed 35-7 at half and 48-7 going into the fourth quarter when quarterback Paul Davis threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to Tariq Culpepper for the last score of the game.

Uni fared better in its second game vs. undefeated Banning, holding a 6-0 halftime lead thanks to a first-quarter touchdown from halfback Raymond Lundy. The Pilots scored 10 third-quarter points to take the lead for good. Senior back Tyrone Nelson led the Wildcat offense with 123 yards in 14 carries. The Uni junior varsity, however, defeated Banning's JV team, 30-15.

The Wildcats won their first game of the season on September 19 at Lincoln, scoring in all four quarters. Uni outscored the Tigers, 27-0, over the final three quarters to win going away. The JV team won as well, 14-0.

UNI ALUMNI NOTEBOOK

Denny Miller, a Uni grad who played basketball for John Wooden at UCLA and went on to a long career in films, television and commercials, passed away on September 9, at age 80.

After graduating Uni in the early 1950s, he lettered for Wooden in 1954 and 1958, mixed in with military service and then a chance to be a movie star at MGM. He starred as "Tarzan

the Ape Man" in 1959 and although the film made money, it was the only time he played the role. He was well known for his role as Duke Shannon in the TV series "Wagon Train" and then as the bearded, yellow-slicker-wearing fisherman for 14 years in commercials for Groton's Fish Sticks.

He moved to Las Vegas in 2002; he contracted ALS over the past year, leading to his death earlier this month.
