Uni teacher *Kerri Eich*, whose 2013 first-period Health class was profiled, was front and center, along with students who participated in the project and staff from Nutribullet, makers of the specialty blenders used to introduce students to a healthier diet.

Everyone who attended had a chance to try the same style of fruit-and-vegetable shakes that the students did, and were hosted at a post-event dinner in the Uni Grove, catered by Uni's Food Science Students and Chef *David Linville*.

"The Uni Project" project continues to draw attention, as *Lori Corbin*, ABC-7 Eyewitness News's Food and Fitness Coach visited Uni on October 9 to observe the program and speak to Eich and current students. Eich, now fondly referred to as the *"Queen of Kale"* for her enthusiasm for the vegetable, said that the segment will air in the next few weeks, but that no date has been set yet.

After accepting a forfeit by Inglewood High School due to suspensions to 31 of its players, Uni stunned long-time Western League champs Venice with a 14-7 win on October 10.

It was the first Uni win over the Gondoliers since 1996 – thus the first in the "Wildcat" era – and ended Venice's 43-game winning streak against Western League opponents. The win earned significant local media coverage as well, in the <u>Los Angeles Times</u>, and the online <u>Los Angeles Sports Journal</u>.

Uni took charge of the game quickly with a 67-yard scoring run by senior captain *Tyrone Nelson* on its first play from scrimmage, and Nelson scored again in the second quarter to give the Wildcats a 14-0 lead. Venice scored before the half to cut the margin to 14-7.

Neither team scored in the second half, with senior cornerback *Thomas Clay* intercepting a Venice pass at the Uni two-yard line in the third quarter to end the biggest Gondolier threat.

Nelson finished with 217 yards rushing and Coach *Lee Lowe* told reporters afterwards, "I had kids crying. It means a lot."

Uni continues its football road show at Hamilton (3-2 overall, 1-0 Western League) this week for a 3 p.m. game.

The Uni junior varsity improved to 5-1 on the season, with wins over Inglewood (8-0) and Venice (14-12).

# **SIXTH PERIOD BELL**

▶ When and why did Uni's nickname change from Warriors to Wildcats?

The Los Angeles Unified School District determined that three high schools – Birmingham, Gardena and University – were to change their team nicknames to eliminate references to American Indians, in September 1997. The decision was challenged in Federal court by alumni from Birmingham, but was upheld in mid-1998. Soon after, Uni students voted to become "Wildcats."

Today, Birmingham's Braves are now the Patriots and Gardena's Mohicans have become Panthers. For more on the story, <u>click here</u>.
