Still time to catch Uni's production of "The Complete Works of William Shakespeare (Abridged)" on-campus on November 21 and 22 Uni's Stivelman Theater will be the scene for the final two performances of a wild romp through the entire Shakespeare catalog beginning on Friday, November 21 at 7:30 p.m. and Saturday, November 22 at 2:00 p.m.

"[It's] a crazy parody of William Shakespeare, performed by a small troupe of actors," notes **Ronnie Sperling** '76, Uni's director of Theater Arts. "In a race with the clock, all of the Bard's 37 plays are presented in just under 90 minutes. In a vaudeville style, actors speak directly to the audience during much of the play, and some scenes involve audience participation. No two performances will be the same."

The Wildcats rebounded after tough losses at Hamilton and Palisades to win their last two games of the regular season and finish with a 5-5 record. Uni's success led to a surprise no. 4 seeding (out of 16 teams) in the City Division II playoffs, with Hamilton at no. 1.

Uni cruised against Fairfax, winning 48-3, piling up 359 yards rushing. Senior halfback *Tyrone Nelson* led the way with 14 carries for 127 yards and three touchdowns. Senior *Raymond Lundy* had a 74-yard run on the way to 107 yards and a touchdown in just four carries. Junior receiver *Eugene Ford* scored a touchdown on a 24-yard pass reception and added a 75-yard punt return for another score. Junior linebacker *Gabriel McClain* had 13 tackles to lead the team.

With the Uni field under construction, "Homecoming" was held at Venice on November 7, with the Wildcats blanking Westchester, 25-0. Uni led 7-0 after a quarter and 13-0 at half, on their way to their first shutout of the season. Uni rushed for 212 yards, led by Nelson again with 101 yards in 13 carries and two touchdowns. Junior quarterback *Paul Davis* also scored a rushing touchdown and threw one to Ford. Sophomore end *Tariq Culpepper* led the receiving corps with six receptions and 100 yards. McClain again led the defense with 13 tackles, ahead of senior linebacker *Montrell Robinson* (12) and senior linebacker *Aaray Brooks Jr.* (10).

The Wildcats stomped Grant, 37-0, at Venice High to win its first playoff game in seven years. Uni took control of the game immediately, leading 16-0 after the first quarter. After a scoreless second quarter, Nelson scored on a five-yard run in the third quarter to increase the lead to 23-0. Nelson scored again on a 20-yard run and soph halfback **David Severin** had a one-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter to end the rout. Nelson finished with 212 yards rushing, aided by 155 yards from Lundy, including a 90-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

Next up is a rematch with South Gate, which crushed Uni, 48-14, in the season opener. This time, it will be a Uni "home game," scheduled for 7 p.m. at Venice High on Friday.

The Uni junior varsity finished the year at 7-3 (3-2 in the Western League) after a tight 32-28 loss against Westchester.

The Uni varsity girls team qualified for the 2014 City Finals with a third-place finish in the second heat of the City Semi-Finals held at Pierce College. The Wildcats had 69 points, behind Granada Hills (37) and Santee (52), led by ninth-grader *Stephanie Cruz*, who finished sixth over the three-mile course in 19:53.49. Senior *Monte Ho* was 13th (20:52.61), followed by junior *Esmeralda Martinez* (19th, 21:23.07) and soph *Chedeya Brown* (20th, 21:24.30) in the top 20.

The varsity boys had a rougher time, finishing eighth in their heat of the City semis, and did not qualify for the City Finals. Junior *Matthew Freeman* was the top Uni finisher, placing 23rd in 17:17.96 for three miles.

Uni's varsity girls will be joined by the girls Junior Varsity and Frosh-Soph teams at next Saturday's City Finals, also at Pierce College, with the first race scheduled for 8:00 a.m.

The Wildcats competed well in the Western League Finals, finishing third in the boys varsity race and second in the girls. The top Wildcat in the boys race was 10th-grader

Jacob Abraham in 14th place (18:12.56 for three miles), followed by junior *Erick Hernandez* (16th, 18:24.36) and senior *Anthony Santiago* (18th, 18:34.79). Five of Uni's top-six scorers were underclassmen, indicating a strong team next season; Palisades won the league title in a tight 25-30 battle against Venice.

Among the girls, Uni was second to Pali (17-52), placing 5-6-12-14-15 to edge Venice (86). Cruz led the way in fifth (20:38.20 for three miles), followed immediately by Ho in 20:40.92.
