A remarkable Uni season came to an end with a 41-28 loss to South Gate in the second round of the City Division II playoffs on November 21. Junior receiver *Eugene Ford* scored on a 68-yard reception in the first quarter and then caught another touchdown — this time from 20 yards — from junior quarterback *Paul Davis* to give Uni a 14-7 lead in the second quarter. Davis snuck in from one yard out to increase the lead to 21-7, but the Rams cut the advantage to 21-14 at half.

South Gate scored two quick touchdowns to take the lead in the third quarter, but Ford caught another touchdown to tie the game at 28-all heading into the final quarter. But the Rams outscored Uni, 13-0, in the fourth quarter to advance to the semifinals against top-seeded Hamilton.

The loss ended the season, which showed continued improvement for the Wildcats and coach Lee Lowe. After taking over a program that had been 1-28 in 2008-09-10, Lowe's first two teams improved to 3-8 in 2011 and 2012 and then to 5-6 in 2013. With significant talent coming back for the 2015 season and a new home field to play on, the Wildcats can seriously think about a winning season for the first time since the 9-5 Wildcats of 2007.

All three Uni girls teams qualified for the City Finals on November 22. The varsity finished 10th out of 11 teams in the Division I race, led by ninth-grader *Stephanie Cruz* in 12th place in 19:38.47 for the third-mile course. Sophomore *Chedeya Brown* was next in 46th (21:14.87) as the only Uni finishers in the top 50.

The junior varsity and frosh-soph teams also finished tenth in their divisions.
