Nelson was named Western League Co-Offensive Player of the Year, with 190 carries for 1,457 yards and 12 touchdowns, plus 60 tackles on defense and two interceptions.

All-City (Division II) Defensive Player of the Year Mcclain had a remarkable 142 total tackles (77 solo), and five sacks on the season.

• Boys/Basketball: 8-4 overall (0-0 Western League)

Steve Ackerman's boys basketball team got off to a terrific 6-0 start, but has then lost four of six to tough non-City competition in a couple of holiday tournaments. The Wildcats are led by 6-1 senior forward Cushan Allen, who is averaging 21.4 points per game and 8.5 rebounds a game. He's shooting 56% from the floor. Junior forward Dwight Murray (6-2) is averaging 16.9 points a game, 5.4 rebounds and a team-leading 3.4 assists.

Ron Cass's Uni girls varsity won its first three games behind star 5-9 senior guard Precious Nwaba, who averaged 31 points a game in the first two before hurting her shoulder in the Amino South contest. She did not play against Carson, but will be fine for future games. Over three games, she's leading the Wildcats with 21.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.3 steals per contest. Junior 6-4 center Jada Gambrah is also in double figures at 10.0 points a game, 7.3 rebounds and 1.8 blocks a game.

Forever young: Born in 1911, *Harold Cunningham* attended what was then known as Warren G. Harding High School in the Sawtelle section of Los Angeles, beginning in 1926. Unfortunately, he never quite finished. Now 103, Cunningham still lives in the same Stoner Avenue home he grew up in, and received a Honorary High School Diploma that was awarded to him in a special ceremony at Uni on Monday, December 8, 2014.

The Los Angeles Unified School District authorized the special diploma using the original Harding High School logotype, but signed by current Uni principal *Eric Davidson*. Congratulations to Hal, who proved that you're never too old to graduate!
