## **ALUMNUS SCOTT KIVEL'S GIFT IN HONOR OF DR. WARREN L. STEINBERG**

- ▣ We reported in the last issue about the progress being made on the new football field and all-weather track now under construction at Uni.

Several readers inquired about the gift by alumnus and former Student Body President **Scott Kivel** '67, who has sponsored the installation of a new announcer's booth on the north side of the field, opposite the stands, which will be used for public address, statistics and media coverage.

Kivel's gift of \$50,000 came with two stipulations, that Uni students would determine how the gift would be used and that the donation would honor Uni's Boys Vice-Principal during Kivel's years, **Dr. Warren L. Steinberg**. The students determined that the field complex needed a proper announcing, statistics and media booth, and it will be installed later this year.

Steinberg (1924-2004) worked in public education for 40 years, with stints at Jordan, Hamilton, Uni, Crenshaw and Fairfax High Schools, among many positions with the L.A. Unified School District.

He founded The Steinberg Family Humanity Foundation in 1982 to reward the development of students as role models and champions who promote the best values and standards in our schools and our communities.

Steinberg and his wife Betty had three sons, including the well-known sports attorney **Leigh Steinberg** and **Hon. Donald Steinberg**, former U.S. Ambassador to Angola and current Deputy Administrator for the United States Agency for International Development (USAID).

Uni finished the 2014-15 season with a 17-14 record after losing a tough 53-50 contest to Washington (13-12) in the City Division I playoff quarterfinals.

Senior 6-1 forward **Cushan Allen** was Uni's leading scorer on the season at 18.5 points per game, and was second in rebounding at 7.8 a game. Senior 5-8 guard **Nicholas Brooks** was the only other Wildcat to average in double figures, at 11.7 points per game. Senior 6-5 forward **Keijon Hickman** led in rebounding at 9.4 a game, while Brooks and soph 5-10 guard **Rudy Eugenio** averaged 2.6 assists a game.

- Girls /Basketball: 19-10 overall (7-5 Western League)

The Wildcats lost a tough, 60-52 decision to top-seeded Narbonne (22-5) in the City Division I quarterfinals on February 20, but won their consolation bracket quarterfinal against Granada Hills, 58-41 on February 27. Uni moves on to the consolation semi-finals against Western League opponent Fairfax (19-12) – at Uni – on March 3. The Wildcats lost twice to the Lions during the regular season.

Uni's star guard, **Precious Nwaba**, took over the game against Granada Hills, scoring 39 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. She shot 10-15 from the floor (4-6 from three-point range), made 15-16 free throws and had five steals. Wow! Senior guard **Lizeth Hernandez** added 13 points for Uni, which took over the game in the third quarter with a 21-7 run.

For the season, Nwaba is averaging 23.4 points, 8.0 rebounds and 4.2 steals per game. Junior center **Jada Gambrah** is next best in scoring at 11.9 points a game, a team-high 9.6 rebounds and 1.2 blocks. Hernandez is up to 10.1 points a game, giving Uni three players scoring in double figures.

## **SIXTH PERIOD BELL**

- ▣ In issue 5, we noted that Uni has two graduates on the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit: **Stephen Reinhardt** S '48 in Los Angeles and **Carlos Bea** S '50 in San Francisco. Now it turns out that there is a third Warrior among the 29 judges on the Court: **Raymond Fisher** S '57.

Bea reports that Fisher was also Student Body President at Uni, before heading to U.C. Santa Barbara and Stanford Law School. Fisher clerked for U.S. Supreme Court Justice William Brennan from 1967-68 before returning to Los Angeles to private practice. After serving in the Clinton Administration as Associate Attorney General from 1997-99, he was nominated by President Bill Clinton for the Ninth Circuit and was easily confirmed. He became a Senior U.S. Circuit Court Judge in 2013.
