UNIVERSITY HIGH GRADUATION SET FOR JUNE 4 ON NEW FIELD & TRACK

The beginning of a new era in Uni's athletic history will appropriately commence with the graduation of the Class of 2015 on the Uni campus on June 4, beginning at 5 p.m.

The long-awaited world-class football field and running track at Uni are now complete, with the striping of the AstroTurf football and soccer field and the Rekortan track, with the final touches applied on May 12.

Class of '65 graduate *Steve Udvar-Hazy*, the billionaire owner of Air Lease Corporation, will be the featured commencement speaker, nine days in advance of the classes of 1965 reunion (more details below). He and his family fled their native Hungary in 1958 due to the Soviet occupation of the country and came to Los Angeles. After finishing at Uni, Udvar-Hazy attended UCLA and then embarked on a remarkable career which saw him, with two partners, essentially create the aircraft-leasing business in the United States. His insight into innovation and entrepreneurship will be of great interest to Uni's 2015 graduates, many of whom are part of the school's highly-respected Digital Media Magnet program.

UNI HI EDUCATION FOUNDATION AWARDS THREE SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS

▶ UHEF Co-President *Judy Wolfenstein* reports that the Foundation delivered three scholarship awards to deserving seniors in the Class of 2015.

Applicants for two of the awards wrote essays specific to those programs, and the awardees were selected by the UHEF Board of Directors. The awards were presented at the annual awards ceremony on May 20.

- The UHEF OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD (\$1,000) was made to *Abigail Diaz*. She has worked with Prime Time, an after-school program for kids with developmental disabilities, sponsored by UCLA, as well as at Arlington Heights Elementary, where she attended primary school. In addition, she has recently graduated from the Los Angeles Police Department's Cadet Academy, and is planning to pursue a university degree in criminal justice.
- The estate of *Sharon Mednick*, a Uni college counselor from 1995-2003, bequeathed \$10,000 to establish a fund to help a student who demonstrates an interest in pursuing a career in education. Thanks to your ongoing support, the Mednick Fund was grown and continues to award \$1,000 annually. The 2015 recipient of the SHARON MEDNICK SCHOLARSHIP is *Ashley Drew*. She realized that teaching drew her to help others and saw the impact of a "spark of inspiration" that helps people want to achieve. Ashley will be attending the University of California. Riverside in the fall.
- For 2015, the UHEF inaugurated the JACK MOSCOWITZ PRINCIPAL'S AWARD in honor of the much-loved former Uni principal who inspired the creation of the UHEF. The selection of the award is made by the University High School Principal and *Eric Davidson* selected *Gabriela Rodriguez*. He describes her as well-liked, a great role model and someone who leads by example. "She gives 100% to everything she does, is wise beyond her years, puts family first, is goal-oriented but also patient," noted Davidson. "She is someone you would want your own child to befriend. She's a wonderful part of the Uni family."

Wolfenstein added "Your ongoing support of the UHEF allows the Foundation to continue awarding these scholarships. Please donate generously to the Foundation and our annual awards funds. • Boys/Golf 10-2 overall Western League Champions

A highly-successful season for Coach *Eric Temena's* boys golf team climaxed with a fourth-place finish in the City Finals on May 20 at Griffith Park.

Western League Champion *Michael Han* (a junior) shot a 72 for a second-place individual finish, followed by junior *Kevin Temena* in 14th (78) and senior *Bryce Howell* in 23rd (80).

Uni's team total of 411 for its top-five-players was just 14 strokes behind winner El Camino Real (397, won with a lower back-nine score), Palisades (also 397) and Granada Hills (402). Congratulations to these Wildcats on a great season.

• Girls/Softball 2-14 overall

Although seeded 15th out of 16 teams in the City Division III playoffs, having won only one game during the regular season, Uni pummeled second-seeded Hollywood, 12-5, in the opening game of the playoffs on May 19. The Wildcats lost a heart-breaker to North Hollywood in the quarterfinals, 9-8, on May 22 to end the season 2-14, but on a positive note.

Girls 200-yard Freestyle: Senior Lizbeth Crispin won the B-Final (and an All-City medal),

finishing ninth overall in 2:10.61.

Girls 200-yard Individual Medley: Crispin finished 12th overall in 2:30.59.

Girls 4x50-yard Freestyle Relay: Uni's team of Mona Farzan, Gloria Fu, Valeria Armijo and Lizbeth

Crispin won All-City medals by finishing sixth in 1:56.21.

Girls 4x50-yard Medley Relay: Uni's team of Ila Castro de la Torre, Lizbeth Crispin, Mona Farzan

and Gloria Fu finished 11th overall in 2:14.89.

In the Girls 4x100-yard Freestyle Relay, Uni competed in the B-final, but was disqualified for having a swimmer start too soon on the exchange.

• Track & Field

Uni had some historic performances to cheer about at the All-City Finals at Cerritos College on May, finishing seventh in the girls team standings (15 points) and scoring one point in the boys division.

Of special note was ninth-grader *Toni Carter*, who won the 400 m and set a new Uni school record of 58.88. She had previously grabbed the Uni 200 m record from former Wildcat star *Barbara Nwaba* '07 in the Western League Finals with a 26.36 second-place finish. Wow! Imagine what she'll be able to do next year on the new, world-class Uni track.

Boys 800 m: Junior Matthew Freeman finished sixth in 1:59.60.

Girls 400 m: Freshman Toni Carter was All-City Champion and set a new Uni

school record of 58.88.

Girls 4 x 100 m Relay: Uni's team of Jada Jenkins, Shania Card, Cach'e Cummings and Toni

Carter finished sixth in 50.68.

Girls 4 x 400 m Relay: Uni's team of Jada Jenkins, Shania Card, Kaylan Tanner and Toni

Carter finished fourth in 4:06.31.

• Boys/Volleyball 16-8 overall

After an excellent 14-7 regular season and a second-place finish in the Western League, Uni was seeded fifth in the City Division II playoffs. The Wildcats reached the quarterfinals by defeating Arleta (3-0) and Belmont (3-0) before running into fourth-seeded Sylmar, losing all three sets by scores of 19-25, 14-25 and 13-25.
