RALPHS SHOPPERS! DONATE TO UNI VIA YOUR REWARDS CARD!

▶ One of the easiest ways to donate to Uni directly is via the Ralphs Rewards Card.

As part of its Community Contribution program, up to 4% of monthly purchases made by Ralphs Rewards Card members is sent to Uni, but only if you designate the school by linking it to your Rewards Card.

It's pretty easy:

- The program is only for Ralphs Rewards Card members, so be sure you have a card (you can enroll online or get one for free at any store).
- Have your card handy (you'll need the number on the back) and visit the Ralphs <u>Community Contribution</u> page.
- Set up your account (you have to give your address so Ralphs can send you coupons) and then designate *University High School* as your non-profit of choice. Uni's organization code for the Ralphs program is *93275*.

That's it! Ralphs, the largest grocery chain in the West, will donate about \$2 million annually to this program, so why not assure Uni of a share!

"YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN" COMING TO UNI ON DECEMBER 3-4-5

▶ Two beloved musicals are on tap for Uni's Theater Arts program this year, starting with "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown" set for four performances over three days in December: Thursday, Friday and Saturday, December 3-4-5.

Auditions for the show are scheduled for September 9-10 at the Stivelman Theater on campus from 3:15-5:15 p.m., supported in part by the UCLA AfterSchool program. Roles in the show and for the technical support crew will be available, under the direction of Uni Theatre Arts director *Ronnie Sperling* '76 and choreography director *Lindsay Lorenz*.

Sperling has already announced the spring show, coming April 27-30 with five performances over four days, "Disney's High School Musical." All performances will be held at Uni's intimate Stivelman Theater on campus; stay tuned for ticket information, but mark your calendars now.

Two Uni players have received pre-season notices as among the best in Southern California, according to the highly-respected *Eric Sondheimer*, writing in the *Los Angeles Times:*

- Offense/receivers: Senior Co-Captain *Eugene Ford* (6-3, 190), All-City (Division II) and All-Western League, who caught 10 touchdowns last season
- ▶ Defense/linebackers: Senior Co-Captain Gabriel McClain (6-0, 220), All-City (Division II) Defensive Player of the Year and All-Western League, with 142 total tackles and five sacks in 2014.

Uni's football program, which has made such significant strides under coach *Lee Lowe*, will miss the City playoffs in 2015 after being penalized for having an ineligible player participate in the 2013 and 2014 programs.

▶ **Barbara Nwaba** '07, the 2015 U.S. national champion in the Heptathlon, represented the United States in the IAAF World Track & Field Championships in Beijing, China on August

22-23. After scoring an excellent 6,500 points to win the American title, Nwaba fell over the fourth hurdle of the opening event, the 100 m hurdles, in Beijing and did not finish, scoring zero points in the event.

Although eliminated from medal contention, she continued to compete and did very well in the remaining six events to score 5,315 points to rank 27th out of 34 athletes who started the event. What if she had repeated her hurdle time from the U.S. championships (13.49)?

If so, she would have scored another 1,052 points for a 6,367-point total and seventh place, just 149 points away from a bronze medal! She now looks forward to the U.S. Olympic Trials next summer to try and make the American Olympic Team headed to Rio.

Add a fifth Uni alum who contributed to the success of the recently-completed Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles: *Kenji Osugi*, who served as the LA2015 Competition Manager for Judo.

Classmate *Barbara Wong* was among several who wrote in about his role:

I would like to say we would be remiss not to recognize my friend and classmate, Kenji Osugi. Fellow Salisian, Class of [W] '68 and all the hard work that he put into the Judo events at UCLA.

I had the opportunity to attend the Judo events. Kenji was instrumental in making it a terrific event for all involved !

Barbara is being modest. The Judo competition, held in the UCLA Student Activities Center gymnasium (formerly the Men's Gym) was completely full daily, with standing-room-only crowds to watch the 105 judokas from 24 nations compete in 18 divisions (nine for men and women).

Osugi was responsible for the organization and production of the competition, which proved to be one of the most popular in the entire World Games with nearly 3,800 jamming in over the four days of divisioning and competition.

He joins the other Warriors who helped make the Games a success, including **Susan Pollack** '81 (Development), **Glen Ratcliff** '76 (Transportation), **Rich Perelman** '74 (Media Operations) and **Larry Jacobson** '74 (ESPN).

▶ No matter how many times we answer this question, we get it again and again. So here's the answer – for the start of the 2015-16 academic year – of "why and when was the Warriors [nickname] changed to Wildcats," this time from *Adrian Cole* (<u>89134cole@cox.net</u>) of the Class of 1954.

The story goes like this: after a lengthy effort by activists, the Los Angeles Unified School District determined that three high schools – Birmingham, Gardena and University – were to change their team nicknames to eliminate references to American Indians, in September 1997. The decision was challenged in Federal court by alumni from Birmingham, but was upheld in mid-1998. Soon after, Uni students voted to become "Wildcats."

Today, Birmingham's Braves are now the Patriots and Gardena's Mohicans have become Panthers. For more details, <u>click here</u>.
