UNI SCORES WELL IN STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED ENGLISH TEST

A lengthy <u>review</u> of student performance on the new, Common Core-linked statewide standardized tests showed about 33% of Los Angeles Unified School District pupils met or exceeded grade-level scores in English.

For the 391 Uni 11th-graders who took the test, the results were much better: 54% were able to met or exceed the 11th-grade standard in English.

This is a significant increase in proficiency, however, from the 8th-grade scores achieved by students from Uni's primary local feeder schools, Emerson Community Charter and Webster Middle School, and Revere Charter, which sends some students to Uni:

English:

Emerson Community Charter: 38% of 500 students met or exceeded grade standards
 Webster Middle School: 16% of 441 students met or exceeded grade standards
 Revere Charter: 59% of 1,979 students met or exceeded grade standards

The results were not as strong in mathematics, where 25% of LAUSD students in grades 3, 8 and 11 were able to test out at grade-standard levels. For the 383 Uni students who took the exam, only 22% were able to meet or exceed the grade-level standard.

Again, however, the performance of Uni students was a step up from the feeder-school scores:

Mathematics:

Emerson Community Charter: 26% of 517 students met or exceeded grade standards
 Webster Middle School: 11% of 451 students met or exceeded grade standards
 Revere Charter: 51% of 1,931 students met or exceeded grade standards

The new, more rigorous exam, used for the first time, is designed to test student proficiency in English and mathematics at the level required for students to attend a four-year college or university. Former California State Superintendent of Schools Bill Honig noted in an interview with the *Los Angeles Times* that the number of students meeting or exceeding grade levels on these exams would be higher "if calibrated to the skills needed to attend a community college, get a two-year nursing certificate or pursue a career in manufacturing."

"YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN" READYING FOR SHOWS ON DECEMBER 3-4-5

The show will be directed by Sperling, with choreography by Lindsey Lorenz and musical direction by David Kamenir.

• Boys/Football 1-3 overall (0-0 Western League)

Uni registered its first win of the 2015 season with a 28-13 victory over Lincoln at Uni's Cavanaugh Field on September 18. Uni took a 22-7 lead at halftime and cruised in with rushing touchdowns from senior back *Gabriel McClain* (two scores; 153 yards in 14 carries in the game) and quarterback *Paul Davis* (one TD). Davis also threw for a touchdown to McClain for a 55-yard touchdown and completed six of 14 passes for 190 yards. McClain also led Uni with 11 tackles and three sacks in the game. Uni gained 417 yards in the game to 310 for Lincoln.

The Wildcats lost at Culver City the following Friday, 34-21. Uni took a 7-0 lead on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Davis to senior end *Eugene Ford*, but trailed 14-13 at halftime. The Centaurs scored once in the third quarter and twice in the fourth to take a 34-13 lead before a final Uni score and two-point conversion. Davis was only 9-26 passing for 124 yards, but did score a rushing touchdown, and McClain had 14 rushes for 100 yards plus 14 tackles. Uni is on the road at 11th-ranked Oaks Christian (5-0) next.

Uni's football program, which has made significant strides under coach *Lee Lowe*, will not participate in the City playoffs in 2015 as part of a penalty for having an ineligible player participate in the 2013 and 2014 seasons.

The Uni Hi Education Foundation exists to raise money to support the instructional programming at University High School. A new LAUSD policy allows *on-campus signage* to be available to recognize donations which assist the educational program.

- One of the easiest ways to donate to Uni directly is via the *Ralphs Rewards Card*. As part of its Community Contribution program, from 1-4% of monthly purchases made by Ralphs Rewards Card members is sent to Uni, but only if you designate the school by linking it to your Rewards Card. It's pretty easy:
 - The program is only for Ralphs Rewards Card members, so be sure you have a card (you can enroll online or get one for free at any store).
 - Have your card handy (you'll need the number on the back) and visit the Ralphs *Community Contribution page* and either *register* or *sign in* (Questions answered *here*).
 - Once you either *sign in* or *register* to set up your account (you have to give your address so Ralphs can send you coupons), you can then designate University High School as your non-profit of choice. Uni's organization code for the Ralphs program is *93275*.
 - Members must swipe their registered Ralphs Rewards Card or use the phone number that is linked to their card when shopping for each purchase to count.

Ralphs, the largest grocery chain in the West, will donate about \$2 million annually to this program, so why not assure Uni of a share!
