RICHARD KAMPMANN STADIUM AND MEL PATTON TRACK TO BE DEDICATED ON OCTOBER 22

▶ The stunning new AstroTurf football field and Rekortan running track at Uni will be formally dedicated by the Los Angeles Unified School District on Thursday, October 22, at 2 p.m., at the new facility.

The public will be welcomed to the field area, where LAUSD Board of Education President *Steve Zimmer* – in whose District 4 area Uni is located – will preside over ceremonies marking the amazing transformation of Uni's athletic field and track from one of the worst in the City to one of the best.

At the same ceremony, the combined facility will be named for Uni's most successful coach, *Dick Kampmann*. Still going strong at 90, Kampmann was the head of the physical education department at Uni and coached cross country and track & field from 1960-85. During that time, he changed the lives of hundreds (if not more than a thousand) young men and women through his leadership and teaching skills. He also compiled a brilliant competitive record, with eight All-City team championships (7 in cross country, 1 in track & field), 24 All-City individual champions, 77 Western League team champions, 252 Western League individual champions and 875 dual-meet wins, vs. 267 losses and 3 ties (a 76.6% winning percentage!).

The track will be dedicated in the memory of the greatest athlete in Uni history: sprinter *Mel Patton* '43. After graduating from Uni as the school's record holder in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, he served two years in the U.S. Navy during World War II and then went on to a great career at USC, winning three NCAA individual titles and setting two world records. At the 1948 Olympic Games, he won gold medals in the 200 m and on the 4x100 m relay, making him the only gold-medal winner in Uni history.

Street parking is available for the ceremony, and guests can enter through the main entrance (a long walk to the field), or from Westgate Avenue (closer) or Ohio Avenue (very close).

"Richard Kampmann Stadium" will have its interscholastic debut the following day when the Wildcats take on Fairfax in the 2015 Homecoming football game at 7 p.m. The first use of the "Mel Patton Track" will take place in the spring as Uni's hosts a home track meet for the first time in more than a decade.

Thanks to the devoted support of Kampmann alumni, Patton fans and friends of Uni, more than \$43,000 has been assembled to support the Uni cross country and track & field teams. Plaques honoring Kampmann and Patton – and the donors – will be unveiled in the spring.

UNI SCORES ON STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED TESTS CRITIQUED

"The headline in the October 1 edition of the <u>Warriors & Wildcats Report</u>, "UNI SCORES WELL IN STATEWIDE STANDARDIZED ENGLISH TEST," reminds me of the current political campaign. Spin, spin, spin. The test scores for Uni and its feeder schools are abysmal and it does no one any good to try to make us think otherwise. Students in the early 1900s received a far better education than anyone is receiving now. This is alarming."

There's plenty to say on this subject, but let's just state that as the Los Angeles of 2015 is a different place than the Los Angeles of 1966, so the Uni student body of 2015 is not the same as the inaugural Class of 1925, the Class of 1966 or many others.

One of the ways that 2015 is different is that unlike 1925 or 1966, people who care can make a direct and immediate difference. The Uni Hi Education Foundation was founded in 1985 by the late *Jack Moskowitz* (then Uni's principal) and concerned parents, worried about the impact of budget cuts being implemented in the wake of revised property tax laws.

Hundreds of donors now give to UHEF annually to help make Uni a better and more productive center for learning and personal growth. The College Counseling Center, new laboratories in chemistry and computer science, dozens of scholarship awards, upgraded classrooms and extra-curricular activities in academic, cultural and athletic pursuits have been created and supported by the Foundation.

"YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN" READYING FOR SHOWS ON DECEMBER 3-4-5

Never say that Uni Theater Arts chief *Ronnie Sperling* '76 isn't on the cutting edge when it comes to selecting timely shows for the Stivelman Theater stage.

With the first *Peanuts*-themed movie in 35 years set to debut at movie theaters on November 6, the cast has been set and rehearsals have started for "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown."

The show is set for four performances over three days in December: Thursday, Friday and Saturday, December 3-4-5, supported in part by the UCLA AfterSchool program:

The show will be directed by Sperling, with choreography by Lindsey Lorenz and musical direction by David Kamenir.

Online purchases allow you to print tickets on your own printer; a small convenience charge of 99 cents plus 3.5% of the sales price is added to your order (\$1.34 for a single \$10 ticket).

ON CAMPUS

- A remarkable new set of on-campus courses is expanding Uni's unique Digital Media Magnet program, and allowing Uni students to obtain college credit while still in high school:
 - In conjunction with West Los Angeles College (part of the Los Angeles Community College District), Uni students can now attend after-school courses on the Uni campus that offer graphic design training using the Adobe Creative Suite (Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign and Premiere Pro) or the WLAC "Introduction to Filmmaking" course which introduces students to the process of planning and producing motion pictures using the Adobe Premiere Pro software suite.
 - These courses are offered after-school in two sessions (three hours each) per week, open to any student in grades 9-12.

As part of the regular Digital Media Magnet program at Uni, courses using the Adobe Creative Suite have now led to the offering of Advanced Placement courses in Studio Art – Drawing, Studio Art – 2-D Design and Studio Art – 3-D Design. College credits are available for these courses if the students pass a spring examination offered by the College Board.

New initiatives are underway to expand the Digital Media Magnet to include Mathematics, Arts, Science and Technology (MAST), to help recruit students to Uni. Classes are being assembled, possibly for the 2016-17 academic year, to teach computer programming (code writing) as part of the Math curriculum and nanotechnology as part of the Science program. Each of these would be three-year sequences of courses to train students for work experience and college-level programs.

• Boys/Football 1-5 overall (0-1 Western League)

In their October 9 Western League opener, Hamilton raced out to a 26-8 lead over Uni after three quarters and won by a 26-16 final. Uni's senior back *Gabriel McClain* again

played well on both offense and defense, with 19 total tackles (13 solo) and 35 yards rushing in five attempts. Senior end *Eugene Ford* caught 11 passes for 145 yards and one touchdown, while quarterback *Paul Davis* had a rough day with 16-40 passing for 192 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. Sophomore end *Kareem Miles* caught the other Uni touchdown pass.

For the season, Ford has caught 35 passes for 617 yards, for a gaudy 17.6 yards-perreception average, and has scored six touchdowns. McClain, who has played in five of Uni's six games, has 63 total tackles (12.6 per game) and has 10 tackles for loss.

Uni was not competitive in its game against Southern Section powerhouse Oaks Christian of Westlake Village, losing 76-8 on October 2. The Lions led 42-0 after the first quarter and 69-8 at halftime, outgaining Uni for the game, 422-175. Uni's only score came on a Davis-to-Ford pass; Ford also made 13 tackles in the game and junior defensive end *Matthew Horwitz* had nine tackles. One small consolation: it was not Uni's worst-ever defeat (0-81 vs. Carson in 1977). In case you're wondering whether it's a home-and-home series: yes, Oaks Christian will play at Cavanaugh Field in 2016.

Uni's football program, which has made significant strides under coach *Lee Lowe*, will not participate in the City playoffs in 2015 as part of a penalty for having an ineligible player participate in the 2013 and 2014 seasons.
