UNI YEARBOOKS COMING TO UHEF.ORG BEGINNING IN JANUARY, 2016

▶ There have been several constants over the more than 90 years of University High School, such as the Administration Building, the spring, and the school yearbook.

You have to visit Uni to see the campus and the spring, But soon, you'll be able to enjoy the yearbooks without leaving home!

The Uni Hi Education Foundation has undertaken, in concert with the school, the task of having all of the available yearbooks digitized and made available online, on the UHEF.org site.

Eight years were selected for the initial test, including 1924 (as Wilson Junior High School, on what became the Harding and Uni site!), 1925, 1926, 1927, 1938, 1942 (including an A10 student named *Norma Baker*, later Marilyn Monroe), 1966 and 1967.

These yearbooks will be available online beginning sometime in January 2016. Online viewing of all of the pages will be free, and viewers will be able to download a PDF version of any year desired for a modest fee. Funds collected from this project will be used to support it, as there are more than 90 total yearbooks to be scanned, paginated and posted for use by UHEF.com visitors.

Yearbooks will generally be posted from the older years forward, owing to their aging condition. But individuals or classes who wish to "jump the line" will be able to do so upon request by pre-payment of the cost of digitizing and presenting their yearbook.

SPARKLING SUCCESS FOR "YOU'RE A GOOD MAN, CHARLIE BROWN"

▶ Chalk up another success for the Uni Theatre Arts team, led by *Ronnie Sperling* '76, in its latest production of "You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown" on December 3-5.

The best review came from *Mia Villasenor* in Uni's *Wildcat* newspaper, including:

"You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown" follows an ordinary day in the life of its titular character, played by **Andy Santiago**, as he tries to become a good person. Santiago, who previously starred in Uni's production of "Working," easily captured the pessimistic and eager nature of Charlie Brown. One particular highlight of the show included Charlie Brown trying (and predictably failing) to fly his kite and allowed Santiago to boast his singing skills.

Since "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown" is an ensemble musical, many other characters besides Charlie Brown received ample time under the spotlight. The entire cast shined on stage and kept the laughs coming with each actor's natural comedic timing.

"Into the Woods" alumnus **Veraliz Cornett** particularly owned the stage as the bossy and aggressive Lucy. From her obsession with becoming a queen to her survey on her level of crabbiness, Cornett stood out and took charge just as Lucy should.

Ayanna Jimenez played the iconic character Snoopy. The scenes in the play with Jimenez on Snoopy's doghouse were always great fun. She led a phenomenal group number about Snoopy's love of suppertime and did great work with portraying the slightly cynical and very imaginative dog of Charlie Brown.

Aaron Samos, who played the Beethoven-loving Schroeder, also earned a lot of laughs during

his scenes with Cornett at the piano and as the glee club conductor. Some of his subtlest moments brought a lot of humor to the play, such as him doing the whip during a group dance scene.

Sarai Benitez, who played Charlie Brown's sister Sally, did a great job with the song that won Kristin Chenoweth her Tony for the same role ("My New Philosophy") and had many great one-liners.

The performer who probably received the most laughs was **Ryan McNeil**, who played Lucy's little brother Linus. McNeil, another "Into the Woods" alumnus, cracked many in the audience up when he sang and danced about his beloved blanket ("My Blanket and Me").

Claire Hafteck played probably the cutest character: Woodstock, a yellow bird and a friend to Snoopy. Her dancing during the quick intermission scenes and her random chirpings brought so much lightness and energy to the stage.

Sperling reflected on the show and the maturation of the Theatre Arts program at Uni:

"Personally, I think with this production of Charlie Brown our Theatre Company is really starting to come together nicely at Uni.

"From the LIVE music to the cast getting it right on the mark. To boot, the sets and costumes were a comic strip come to life. There was one day during our Easter Vacation Break, that the entire cast and crew showed up to rehearse, build, and paint. So inspiring to watch these young people. It was magic time. Everyone working so hard ... together. It was like an old Summer Stock company. Real theatre.

"Now, we have just received <u>a glowing full page review</u> in the school paper. I'm looking forward to more school involvement. That includes our Staff, Faculty, and Parents. We NEED you! I know with High School Musical it's going to be an exciting time to be at UNI."

Did you know that Uni once again has its own Speech & Debate Team? Coach *Ethan Keogh* (ethankeogh@gmail.com) shared this update:

"As the coach of Uni Speech Team, it is a great pleasure to share with you my first Fall report. I will start by saying there has been tremendous support for this program from the school, from the [Uni Hi] Education Foundation, and from the community, as well as the parents and students. It's exciting to be a part of this, and witness something thrilling come alive. In just about two months of work, Uni does indeed have a team, with currently ten students on the roster. I'm also happy to report that Uni High School competed in its first tournament of the 21st Century!

"On November 21st, we completed at the Varsity Tournament at South High School in Torrance. We had three club members compete: *Ari Zapata, Aaron Rovinsky*, and

Hannah Grace Smith. All three of our brave front-runners exceeded expectations, each receiving at least one score of 'Excellent.' Further, Hannah received a *First Place* trophy in Oratorical Interpretation for her take on the 'Ellen DeGeneres Graduation Speech at Tulane University.'

"Coming out of our first tournament, the team is excited about competing again sooner rather than later. I hope that we have more members will join us and get to experience the thrill of competition and the lessons it contains.

"All in all, I encouraged by the interest & talent our team has displayed and grateful for your part in it. Together we are putting Uni back onto the Speech & Debate map for the first time since the 1970s. Keeping the lines of communication open is important to the success of this undertaking. • Boys/Basketball 8-4 overall

Under the direction of *Steve Ackerman*, the Wildcats have been busy with tournament play and are 8-4 heading into the holiday break. Junior wing *Jude Agbasi* has been Uni's best performer, averaging 19.3 points a game and 9.0 rebounds, while shooting 58% from the floor. He had a season-high 30 points in the loss vs. Crossroads and 29 in the championship game of the Uni Tournament vs. Bernstein. No wonder he wears jersey no. 1!

Junior guard *Rudy Eugenio* leads the team in assists at 3.5 per game, and scores 9.4 points per game, second-best on the team.
