UNI STUDENT BODY SNAPSHOT: 1,670 STUDENTS ENROLLED

▶ The Los Angeles Unified School District requires that each of its school collect a census of the student body for each academic year. For the 2015-16 year, Uni's demographic spread as of December was:

American Indian/Alaska native:	4 students	0.2%
Asian:	126	7.5%
Black:	399	23.9%
Filipino:	34	2.0%
Hispanic:	916	54.9%
Pacific Islander:	7	0.4%
White:	172	10.3%
Unknown:	12	0.7%

The total of 1,670 students, in grades 9-12, is a different reality from the 3,000+ students that used to attend Uni in grades 10-12, but is an accurate reflection of the student bodies in LAUSD schools. The goal of the UHEF is to assist the educational effort on-campus to make the Uni experience as good or better for today's students as it was at any time in the past.

UNI YEARBOOKS COMING TO UHEF.ORG BEGINNING IN JANUARY, 2016

▶ The Uni yearbook project is well underway, with the functionality of the first eight yearbooks now in the testing stage.

Once opened, readers will be able to do much more than simply see their yearbook online:

- Each class year (and yearbook) will have a separate page, on which the yearbook can be viewed, page-by-page, in two-page spread, just as you would view it in print.
- Readers can also purchase a PDF copy of any yearbook, via download, for a fee. Proceeds from these sales will go back into the yearbook project, to help digitize more years.
- At the top of each class/yearbook page will be opportunities for sponsorship, and for dedications (there will be a fee for these options), to be shown at the top of the page.
- Below each yearbook's page view will be a space for comments "Class Chatter" which will allow you to post messages that can be viewed by all readers of that class page. This is a free service that can help to keep class members informed of events, get-togethers, reunions and personal updates!

The first yearbooks to be posted will be 1924 (as Wilson Junior High School, on what became the Harding and Uni site!), 1925, 1926, 1927, 1938, 1942, 1966 and 1967.

These yearbooks will be available online beginning sometime in January 2016. Yearbooks will generally be posted from the older years forward, owing to their aging condition.

Individuals or classes who wish to "jump the line" will be able to do so upon request by prepayment of the cost of digitizing and presenting their yearbook. Look for more details on this aspect once the first yearbooks are posted.

MASSIVE EMERSON MIDDLE SCHOOL MODERNIZATION PROJECT DEDICATED

• One of Uni's main feeder schools, Emerson Middle School, has been under construction for almost two years, receiving its first major improvement work since 1940!

The project was formally dedicated on November 18, in the new gymnasium, which rises above Selby Avenue. Board of Education President Steve Zimmer, who dedicated Uni's new field and track on October 18, presided over the ceremony.

The Emerson facilities improvement program included:

- New gymnasium, with a basketball court, dance classroom, music classroom and locker rooms and showers.
- Renovation of existing spaces into two arts classrooms and two computer lab rooms.
- New, synthetic-turf outdoor field (a first for Emerson!) and multi-sport outdoor courts.
- Elegant new all-electronic LED marquee and flagpole at the main entrance on Selby Avenue.
- New bus and student drop-off lane on Selby Avenue, plus new staff parking and a reconfigured traffic flow.

Zimmer, as has become his custom, engaged in an athletic contest with Emerson Principal Dimone Watson on the basketball court; at the Uni field dedication, he threw the football around with Principal Eric Davidson and two Uni players. More importantly, the ribbon-cutting ceremony marked a new era for the 952 students at Emerson, in a substantially-improved campus. Congratulations to Zimmer, the District 4 representative, for his efforts to make these improvements to a school which desperately needed them.
