## FIRST 8 UNI YEARBOOKS NOW ONLINE AT UHEF.ORG!

▶ The first eight of more than 90 Uni yearbooks are now online at the UHEF.org Web site and can be viewed by clicking <u>here</u>!

When you get to the Yearbooks page, you can click on any of the covers and browse any of the books now online. If you click the "Purchase" button below each cover, you'll be taken to another page with options for:

- (1) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook, for \$99, or
- (2) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and adding a Dedication that will be shown on that page indefinitely, for \$149, or
- (3) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and becoming a Presenter of that class yearbook, shown on the top of the page indefinitely, for \$199.

Payments are taken by credit card through PayPal, but you don't have to have a PayPal account to use it.

The yearbook section is still being tweaked, so don't be surprised if there are modest changes to the formatting in the coming weeks.

The first yearbooks to be posted are 1924 (as Wilson Junior High School, on what became the Harding and Uni site!), 1925, 1926, 1927, 1938, 1942, 1966 and 1967.

Yearbooks will generally be posted from the older years forward, owing to their aging condition. Individuals or classes who wish to "jump the line" will be able to do so upon request by pre-payment of the cost of digitizing and presenting their yearbook.

The cost for "Advanced Publication" of any specific year is a one-time payment of \$499 (an average of the costs for all yearbooks for scanning, editing, page matching, posting and server maintenance), which includes two downloads and Presenter status on the class page.

## HISTORIC UNI TRACK & FIELD SEASON OPENS ON MARCH 11

▶ Two-time City varsity boys champions Uni hasn't had a home track & field meet in more than a decade, but all of that will come to an end on Friday, March 11, when the Wildcats will meet the Dorsey Dons in a dual meet at Kampmann Stadium and Patton Track, beginning at 2:30 p.m.

It will be the start of a remarkable, all-home meet season for Uni, which is being honored by having all of its meets held on campus in 2016, thanks to the installation of the new Rekortan track and AstroTurf infield, dedicated last Fall. The schedule (*free admission*):

In addition, the Western League Relays and the league prelims and finals are also expected to be held at Uni.

Having the first home meet in the new Kampmann Stadium against Dorsey is especially fitting since Coach *Dick Kampmann* came to Uni <u>from</u> Dorsey to begin a quarter-century of excellence in the spring of 1960.

▶ In conjunction with the first home track & field meets in years, we have received multiple alumni requests for a current list of Uni school track & field records.

The Uni records "list" was kept on a giant plaque created during the Kampmann Era and updated for years afterwards, displayed in the Uni gym on Westgate Avenue. However, when the rebuilt facility on Westgate was demolished about 2008 due to its position near an earthquake fault, the records plaque was trashed.

Based on photographs of the remains of the plaque, marks posted to *Athletic.net* and California State Meet results, the following lists are an *attempt* to compile the best outdoor marks made by University High School track & field athletes. There is reasonable confidence in the Boys marks, but not for many of the Girls marks.

Unfortunately, good reference materials on Uni athletes, such as end-of-season best-marks lists, scorebooks, City prelims and finals results and City-wide best-marks lists from 1986-present were not available. Only fully-automatic times are shown in 100ths of a second; marks originally hand-timed are NOT converted.

# AUDITIONS YIELD A BIG CAST FOR "DISNEY'S HIGH SCHOOL MUSICAL"

▶ Uni's spring theater spectacular, "Disney's High School Musical," got off to a roaring start at auditions, with 100 trying out for on-stage or backstage roles.

Theatre Arts chief *Ronnie Sperling* '76 reports that the sessions placed 38 in the actual cast – "by far our largest cast" – plus 15 more for the Uni Drumline and an additional 25 who will assist with the technical production of the program.

The show is set for April 26-29 at the Stivelman Theater; ticket information will be available soon and ticket sales will be available online. Uni's Theatre Arts program is sponsored in part by UCLA AfterSchool.

## ON CAMPUS

▶ Uni Principal *Eric Davidson* reports that the Collins & Katz Family YMCA now under construction at Westgate and Ohio Avenues is well on its way to completion:

"The YMCA held its topping-out ceremony in November. The roof structure should be complete before El Nino arrives. They are on schedule to be open November of 2016. We are collaborating on a schedule for our instructional and athletics programs."

If you are in the Uni vicinity and have a chance to see this project, it's quite impressive. Once completed, it will provide Uni with additional gym, swimming, locker room and meeting facilities, plus underground parking. More details and pictures are <u>here</u>.

• Boys/Basketball 12-13 overall (1-6 Western League)

Since a 63-57 win over Palisades on January 11, Uni has dropped six in a row, including five in league play. Junior guard *Gabe Okmin*, who has only played since January 1, has now taken over the scoring lead at 16.2 points per game, ahead of junior point guard *Jude Agbasi* (16.0). Agbasi and junior wing *Kevin Javier* co-lead the team with 7.7 rebounds a game. If you want to see the Wildcats in action, tickets for night home games are \$7 for adults and \$5 for students.

Washington replaces *Lee Lowe*, who left to pursue coaching opportunities at the Community College level after the 2015 season.

▶ As a part of the National Football League's salute to Super Bowl 50, Uni received a Wilson Golden Football as part of its Super Bowl High School Honor Roll.

The Honor Roll initiative recognizes schools and communities that contributed to Super Bowl history and positively impacted the game of football. From the NFL:

"High schools across the nation, and around the world, will receive a commemorative Wilson Golden Football for every player or head coach who graduated from their school and was on an UHEF Warriors & Wildcats Report

active Super Bowl roster. Nearly 3,000 players and head coaches, and more than 2,000 high schools, will be recognized. Players and coaches will also have the opportunity to personally deliver golden footballs.

"The NFL Foundation will provide the schools with a new character-education curriculum and the opportunity to apply for grants of up to \$5,000 to help support and grow their football programs. The NFL Foundation has invested \$1 million towards the campaign."

Uni Principal Davidson noted that "the player representing University High School was *Steve Smith, Sr.* 

"Mr. Smith played for the 2003 Carolina Panthers team that lost to the New England Patriots, 32-29. He has had an amazing career and we are honored to have the ball displayed in the trophy case of the South Gym."

Smith, who graduated from Uni in 1997 and attended the University of Utah before heading to the NFL, is a five-time Pro Bowl section and currently plays for the Baltimore Ravens. He's also the Uni school record holder for the 300 m hurdles at 38.73 (see page 3: he was listed on the records plaque as "Stevonne Smith")!
