# UNI AT THE OLYMPIC GAMES: BARB NWABA '07 12th IN HEPTATHLON

Uni's first Olympian in 68 years overcame a slow start to finish 12th in the Olympic heptathlon in Rio de Janeiro. *Barbara Nwaba* '07 entered the event as the U.S. champion after winning the Olympic Trials in July and had high hopes of competing for a medal.

At the Games, she started slowly in the 100-meter hurdles, running 13.81 for 1,005 points. She then high jumped 6-0 (1,016 points) and threw the shot put 48-7 1/4 (848 points) before finishing the day with a mark of 24.77 in the 200 meters (908) points. Her first-day total of 3,777 had her in 11th place overall.

On Saturday, she opened with a long jump of 19-0 3/4 for 792 points, then threw the javelin 153-8 (799) and finished with the 800 m in 2:11.61 for 941 points and a total of 6,309.

She was well back of her lifetime best of 6,500 points from 2015, but at age 27, she has her best days in front of her and can certainly expect to compete to be on the U.S. team for Tokyo in 2020. If she makes it, she would be Uni's first-ever two-time Olympian!

Uni had another Olympic connection to Rio through *Melanie Goodman* '74. Her daughter, Andi Murez, was an All-American swimmer for Stanford and competed for Israel at Rio in the 50 m Freestyle, 100 m Freestyle and 4x100 m Freestyle Relay. She swam well, but did not advance out of the preliminaries in any of her events. On to Tokyo!

## UNI ONLINE YEARBOOK PROJECT: NOW UP TO 37 YEARS OF MEMORIES ONLINE!

These books are scans of Chieftains from the Uni library, which does not include yearbooks from 1928 or 1934. Do you have one of these books? If so, the UHEF would like to scan it and include it in the online archive! There were no Chieftains published in 1943 and 1944 due to World War II, a loss to history, but understandable as paper was a collected commodity during the conflict.

While Chieftains are being posted from oldest to newest, the 1950, 1959 and 1965 yearbooks "jumped the line" thanks to the support of devoted Uni alumni:

If you would like to see your yearbook brought online more quickly, you can ask for "Advanced Publication." For a donation to the UHEF of \$499 (the average cost of digitizing and posting a single yearbook), a specific year can be brought forward in the order and posted online more rapidly than normal.

If you would like to be the Class Presenter for any of the yearbooks, please <u>click here</u> and in the space for "How are you affiliated with Uni?," please write "Class Presenter 19xx" for the year which you want to support. Class Presenters receive two complimentary downloads of their year and Presenter status on the class page.

When you visit the UHEF.org <u>Yearbooks page</u>, you can click on any of the covers and browse any of the books now online. If you click the "Purchase" button below each cover, you'll be taken to another page with options for:

- (1) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook, for \$99, or
- (2) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and adding a Dedication that will be shown on that page indefinitely, for \$149, or
- (3) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and becoming a Presenter of that class yearbook (if available), shown on the top of the page indefinitely, for \$199.

### **UNI ALUMNI NOTEBOOK**

- Sad news of Warriors we have lost:
  - *Bruce Froehlich* (1939-2016) on July 20. Believed to be from the Uni Class of 1957, Bruce was a well-respected developer and builder in the Los Angeles area for many years before retiring in Rancho Mirage. He served with the Air National Guard during the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962 and was active on his class reunion committees for many years. More *here*.
  - **David Horowitz** (1929-2016) on July 17, at age 86. Believed to be from the Class of 1947, he was a widely-known entertainment publicist, especially noted for his success in promoting films for Academy Awards, at the Rogers & Cowan public relations firm and later at Warner Bros. Studios. He was deeply involved in the promotion of civil rights, Native American causes and for the State of Israel. More *here*.

#### From Jim Rosvall '59:

I am sad to say that Richard Farnham passed away six years ago at the age of 90. I have a copy of his obituary and will be glad to email it to anyone who wishes it. In 1961, he and a number of other teachers at Uni opted to transfer to the new Palisades High. Most of those teachers have passed on (including chemistry teacher Ralph Hedges). I taught biology in the room next to Mr. Farnham and across the hall from Mr. Hedges for over 20 years. It was a unique experience teaching with teachers I had at Uni. I have some wonderful memories of working with the both of them. If you wish any further information, don't hesitate to email me.

▶ With football season almost here, ever wonder which Uni grads made it the NFL? Answer: 5!

Steve Smith '97 is the only currently-active Warrior, playing for the Baltimore Ravens. He's a likely Hall of Famer at receiver, having played 15 seasons with 961 career receptions, 13,932 yards and 76 touchdowns. He's the best football player Uni has ever produced.

The other four NFLers from Uni had less success: *Darryl Hobbs* played in 59 games for four teams at receiver from 1993-97; *Lamar Lyons* was a defensive back for Oakland and Baltimore in 1996 and 1997; *Paul Richardson* was a receiver for Philadelphia in 1993 only and *Jay Walker* played quarterback for the Vikings in 1996-97. Now you know!
