FROM DEAN TORRENCE '58: "SURF CITY: THE JAN AND DEAN STORY"

▶ Legendary entertainment talents including Marilyn Monroe (then Norma Baker), Elizabeth Taylor, Randy Newman and many, many more have been part of the University High School tradition. But in the early-'60s heyday of the Surf culture, was anyone bigger than Jan & Dean?

Both *Jan Berry* '58 and *Dean Torrence* '58 attended Uni and Torrence has told their story in his just-published book, "*Surf City: The Jan and Dean Story*," now available at Amazon.com. About the book:

"The Jan and Dean Story is a personal story of the iconic musician and entrepreneur Dean Torrence. As a memoir, The Jan and Dean Story has elements of humor, tragedy and

redemption. It tells their story from the early high school friendship struck up between Jan Berry and Dean Torrence and their ascent to the dizzying heights of stardom riding the crest of the "surf" craze. The Jan and Dean Story is as much about the culture of the 1960s as it is about music. Dean has lived an incredible life and continues to promote a lifestyle and surf culture that is now universally admired and followed throughout the world.

"The story also recounts Jan's tragic car accident and his ability to recover enough to continue to perform will be inspiring to many readers even those not familiar with surf music. For pop culture addicts and music buffs alike this book is indispensable. As early teen icons, Jan and Dean left an indelible mark on the music of the 60's and the American psyche."

Torrence sent us a notice of the publication date of September 27, adding "Thought you might enjoy seeing and maybe even reading this book, all about West Los Angeles." And an amazing time in America, when West Coast surfers – like Uni's Jan & Dean – introduced a new vocabulary, lifestyle and music to the world.

FIRST-EVER GIRLS GOLF TEAM STARTED AT UNI

▶ The ancient English proverb "Mighty oaks from little acorns grow" applies fully to the expanding golf program at Uni. From coach *Eric Temena*:

"I am a PGA golf professional by trade and a secondary education teacher through my college degree. As a golf professional at Brentwood Country Club, I conduct all the golf tournaments; give individual and group lessons; grow and promote junior golf programs; and assist managing the golf staff.

"I was asked to revive the boy's golf team at Uni about three years ago when the school found out that I was a golf professional and have children who play competitive golf. In my first year, our boys team finished second in our league and had three boys play in the City Finals and one boy advanced to the Sectional Finals. In my second year, we won the League finals and had two boys advanced to the City and Sectional finals. Last season, we finished second in our league and had one boy [Eric's son, Kevin] advanced to the City and Sectional finals.

"The formation of the girl's golf team is due to an aspiration to provide an equal opportunity for the girls to learn and play golf. The promotion to form a girl's golf team was done through a girl [Eric's daughter Kara] who played on the boy's team two years ago when we won the League championship. She also happened to be the third best player in the team. Last year, she played in the girl's league as an individual athlete and was the medalist in All-League matches. She played in the City Finals and Sectional Finals, where she finished as the lowest score from all the girls from the City section. Parents of current and incoming students heard of her accomplishments and inquired about creating a girl's team. This year we are fortunate to have enough players to form a girl's golf team, which may be the first-ever in the school's history."


With financial help from the Uni Hi Education Foundation, the girl's golf program has completed its first practice rounds and is getting starting play against other Western League programs. The star is, unsurprisingly, Eric's daughter Kara, who shot 40 for the nine-hole course at Penmar Golf Course on September 16. The other players include Akira Shelton (shot 58), Rose Upton (73), Eurielle Secarro (75) and Alison Wilbur (76).

Congratulations to the girls and to Coach Temena for putting together this history-making squad.

These books are scans of Chieftains from the Uni library, which does not include yearbooks from 1928 or 1934. Do you have one of these books? If so, the UHEF would like to scan it and include it in the online archive. There were no Chieftains published in 1943 and 1944 due to World War II, but a special scrapbook of Uni faculty and staff who served in the military is included as a special memory of that time.

While Chieftains are being posted from oldest to newest, the 1950, 1959 and 1965 yearbooks "jumped the line" thanks to the support of devoted Uni alumni:

If you would like to see your yearbook from 1975-2000 (except 1986) brought online more quickly, you can ask for "Advanced Publication." For a donation to the UHEF of \$499 (the average cost of digitizing and posting a single yearbook), a specific year can be brought forward in the order and posted online more rapidly than normal.

Class Presenters receive two complimentary downloads of their year and Presenter status on the class page.

Boys/Football:

Despite a transportation delay that caused the game to start 20 minutes late, Uni won an exciting overtime game at Lincoln on September 16, 20-14, thanks to 123 yards rushing from *Terrell Cox Jr.* and rushing and passing touchdowns from quarterback *Takai Rogers*. The Wildcats fell to Culver City at home, 35-7, but running back *Maxwell Obeng* had 107 yards rushing on 14 carries. • Congratulations to Uni's three-time All-City forward *David Nwaba* '11, who has been invited to the Los Angeles Defenders training camp. The Defenders are the Los Angeles Lakers franchise in the NBA's Development League.

After finishing at Uni in 2011, Nwaba attended Hawaii Pacific University on scholarship and redshirted, then heading to Santa Monica College for one year in 2012-13. He was recruited to Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo and played three years, averaging 11.7, 11.4 and 12.5 points per game for the Mustangs. The 6-4 guard was SLO's leading scorer last season and earned Honorable Mention All-Big West honors.

This has been a big year in the Nwaba household, with oldest sister *Barbara Nwaba* '07 winning the U.S. title in the heptathlon and competing in the 2016 Olympic Games.

"I did not realize Brian Kingman was a Uni alum. I have lived in the Bay Area most of my adult life, and I remember when he was a part of the A's rotation. While he did not have a stellar career, he did earn a spot on the cover of Sports Illustrated. I remember the cover, because Oakland truly had a remarkable starting five at that time. I think they each threw more complete games in one season than the entire major leagues do now. Of course, they probably all blew out their arms because of it."
