- Online ticket sales continue for the re-opening of Stivelman Theater for four performances of the famed musical, *The Fantasticks*. Uni's version for 2016 will feature:

Among the cast are many students new to the Theater Arts program. Herrella came to Uni only this year and is originally from the Philippines, Shelton is a Uni freshman and Molinaro is also new to Uni and initially wanted to be part of the stage crew. He ended up auditioning instead and won the part of Matt!

The original *The Fantasticks* opened in New York on May 3, 1960, and played off-Broadway for 17,162 performances before closing on January 13, 2002, making it the longest running musical in history. Winner of a Tony Honor for Excellence in Theatre, *The Fantasticks* is a lyrical and romantic musical that tells an allegorical love story about a boy, a girl, two mothers (in the Uni version) and a wall.

# **ALUMNI RE-FILLING THE UNI LIBRARY!**

Thanks to the direct support of Uni alumni, the first Wish List of books for the Uni library has been completely exhausted and a second list of titles posted for your inspection!

Uni alumna and school librarian *Tascha Folsoi* '86 shared the good news:

"The entire list of books on robotics has been purchased! This is really exciting for us, particularly as the request for this topic was student-generated. The next list is pulled from a list of student requests for specific books, both novels and non-fiction. As we buy new books, we are beginning to weed out others that haven't been checked out in decades. It's exciting to begin to update our collection to meet the needs of this generation. My thanks to all involved."

The first group of books centered on robotics in direct requests from students, and were purchased by Uni alumni including *Ivan Finkle* '50, *Ruth Albert Wasser* '64, *Jeff Deckman* '76 and *Ruth Roberts* (no class year provided).

The <u>second set of books</u> on the Wish List include both fiction and non-fiction, especially some interesting biographies and survey works:

- Becoming Beyoncé: The Untold Story, by J. Randy Taraborrelli;
- Elon Musk: Tesla, SpaceX, and the Quest for a Fantastic Future, by Ashlee Vance;
- What Color Is My World?: The Lost History of African-American Inventors, by Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Raymond Obstfeld and Ben Boos.



The "University Senior High Library" Wish List enjoys Amazon Prime status thanks to Folsoi, which means in-stock books will arrive at the library within two business days! However, you (as the purchaser) <u>do not</u> have to be an Amazon Prime member to buy any of the books!

Folsoi asked for help if you buy a book: "I think it would be better if we also asked people to email me their name and grad year along with items purchased, so I can email them back with the tax I.D. number and also remove the items from the list." # UNI ONLINE YEARBOOK PROJECT: 1928 FOUND!

An amazing note from **Donald Grandfield** '59 will help Uni fill in the last hole in its collection of yearbooks from the first class of Wilson Junior High School (!) in 1924 until today.

We don't have all the details yet, but Grandfield informed the UHEF that he has a 1928 Chieftain, the last issue not currently available at the Uni library. Along with the 1934 Chieftain recently obtained, the library will now have a complete set. Thanks!

The 1928 and 1934 Chieftains will be sent for scanning, of course, so that it can join the UHEF's online archive. Some 56 editions of the Uni yearbook (plus the 1924 Wilson Jr. High yearbook) are now available to enjoy, free of charge at UHEF.org: click <u>here</u>. The online library now includes:

While Chieftains are being posted from oldest to newest, the 1950, 1959 and 1965 yearbooks "jumped the line" thanks to the support of devoted Uni alumni:

If you would like to see your yearbook from 1985-2000 (except 1986) brought online more quickly, you can ask for "Advanced Publication." For a donation to the UHEF of \$499 (the

average cost of digitizing and posting a single yearbook), a specific year can be brought forward in the order and posted online more rapidly than normal.

If you would like to be the Class Presenter for any of the yearbooks, please <u>click here</u> and in the space for "How are you affiliated with Uni?," please write "Class Presenter 19xx" for the year which you want to support. Class Presenters receive two complimentary downloads of their year and Presenter status on the class page.

When you visit the UHEF.org <u>Yearbooks page</u>, you can click on any of the covers and browse any of the books now online. If you click the "Purchase" button below each cover, you'll be taken to another page with options for:

- (1) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook, for \$99, or
- (2) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and adding a Dedication that will be shown on that page indefinitely, for \$149, or
- (3) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and becoming a Presenter of that class yearbook (if available), shown on the top of the page indefinitely, for \$199.

• Girls Volleyball wins Los Angeles City Division III Championship!

Uni won the 2016 City Division III title by defeating Central City Value, 25-19, 18-25, 25-19, 19-25, 15-9, on Saturday, November 12 at the Roybal Learning Center in downtown Los Angeles.

Coach *Emilio Alvarado's* Wildcats compiled a 17-7 regular-season record and 7-5 in the highly-competitive Western League. Uni was top-seeded in the City Division III playoffs and won its matches against Middle College (3 sets to 0), Valley Academy of Arts and Sciences (3-0) and Rivera (3-0), to get to the championship match.

Uni (21-7) will now enter the California State Division V playoffs and is seeded eighth, going into its first match vs. Thousand Oaks Hillcrest Christian on November 16, at the Uni South Gym, at 7 p.m.

• Boys/Football:

Uni started well with two wins in three games, but lost its final seven regular-season games to end at 2-8. The Wildcats were seeded 11th in the City Division II playoffs, but

lost a thriller at sixth-ranked Huntington Park, 28-21, on November 10.

The Spartans had a 7-0 halftime lead, but Uni tied it in the third quarter thanks to a *Michael James* rushing touchdown from 12 yards out. But Huntington Park scored the next 21 points to take a 28-7 lead midway through the fourth quarter before the fireworks started. *Terrell Cox Jr.* ran for a score with just a couple of minutes remaining, but then Uni recovered a fumbled kickoff at the H.P. 10 with 1:48 to play. A *Takai Rogers* to *Kareem Miles* pass resulted in a five-yard touchdown to make the score 28-21, but that is as close as Uni got, finishing the season at 2-9. (\* = Western League games):

(Western League opponents Venice, Palisades and Hamilton are in City Division I; Uni, Fairfax and Westchester are in Division II.)

#### Cross Country

The Uni varsity finished fourth in the City Division II preliminaries and qualified for the Division II City Finals at Pierce College on November 19. Uni finished 18-29-20-27-31 to make it to the final, led by junior *Jack Koscheka* (18:47.35 for three miles) in 18th, then senior *Jacob Abraham* (18:47:41) and junior *Ruben Perez Morales* (18:50.96).

Uni's girls team also made it into the Division II City Finals, finishing third in its heat, led by overall winner *Stephanie Cruz*. Just a junior, she won by more than 24 seconds in 20:12.01 (three miles) and led a 1-16-23-28-30 (also 32-34) finish. Seniors *Kaylan Tanner* (22:45.29), *Cristina Santos* (23:48.09), *Nancy Gomez* (24:30.27) and junior *Nicolette Greif* (24:50.47) also scored for the Wildcats.

Uni's Girls Junior Varsity team will also run in the City Finals, having qualified directly out of the Western League meet (for which we have no results; sorry).

#### • Girls/Golf

The first year of Coach *Eric Temena*'s Uni girls golf team ended with a 10th-place finish by daughter *Kara Temena* in the All-City Finals at Balboa Golf Course, shooting 83 for equal-ninth, but losing on a tie-breaker. She qualified for the Southern California Regional Championships, but did not advance to the State Tournament, shooting an 86 to tie for 90th place.

• Girls/Tennis:

The Wildcats did not get invited to the City playoffs, despite finishing the season at 9-4 (8-4 in Western League matches), winning five of their last six matches. However, freshman *Olivia McIntosh-Adams* – who compiled a 7-0 singles record – has been invited to compete in the City's 32-player individual tennis tournament, starting November 28 at the Balboa Sports Center in Encino.

▶ Congratulations to *David Nwaba* '11, who made the roster of the Los Angeles D-Fenders, the NBA Development League team of the Los Angeles Lakers of the NBA.

He's made an immediate impact off the bench, scoring 11 points (and seven rebounds) in the season opener vs. Iowa and then 15 points (and five rebounds) at Santa Cruz, both wins for the D-Fenders. Nwaba's Uni coach, *Steve Ackerman* '89, was a proud spectator for the season opener at the Toyota Sports Center in El Segundo!

Nwaba was twice the Western League Player of the Year while at Uni and after transferring from Santa Monica College, played three years of collegiate basketball for Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. He's a 6-4, 210 lbs. guard; the D-Fenders will play through April 1; check out their season's schedule (and broadcast information) here.
