
Tickets are priced at \$10 for adults and \$5 for students with identification. You can buy tickets *online* up to one day prior to the show date by credit card here (buyer pays credit card and handling fee), or in cash (only) on-campus at the University High School Student Store,

or at the Box Office before each performance. *Holders of valid* WARRIORS & WILDCATS ACTIVITY CARDS *are admitted free, of course!*

Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie*Sperling '76, promises a great show, with a running time of two hours total. The program will feature:

The original *The Fantasticks* opened in New York on May 3, 1960, and played off-Broadway for 17,162 performances before closing on January 13, 2002, making it the longest running musical in history. Winner of a Tony Honor for Excellence in Theatre, *The Fantasticks* is a lyrical and romantic musical that tells an



allegorical love story about a boy, a girl, two mothers (in the Uni version) and a wall.

The theater itself will be one of the stars of the show, with an all-new lobby, flooring, seating and sound systems. Stivelman Theater at University High School (11800 Texas Avenue, Los Angeles, California 90025) is located on the Texas Avenue side of the school.

Ample street parking is available. Refunds available only up to the day prior to the show. Refunds will not be issued for missed performances.

UNI ONLINE YEARBOOK PROJECT NEARING COMPLETION

After more than a year of planning and production efforts, a total of 66 school yearbooks are now online and viewable, free of charge, at www.uhef.org/unihighyearbooks.

This is a remarkable legacy achievement, created in conjunction with Uni's librarian, *Tascha Folsoi* '86. Nearly all of the yearbooks from 1924 – for what was them known as Wilson Jr. High School – through 1994 have been scanned, matched and uploaded. By decade:

•	1924-29:	Missing 1928, but a copy has been offered by <i>Donald Grandfield</i> '59, which
		will be scanned and added as soon as possible.

- 1930-39: Missing 1934, for which a copy has been found and is now being scanned.
- 1940-49: Complete, although yearbooks were not produced for 1943 and 1944 due to paper rationing during World War II. A special scrapbook of Uni faculty and staff who served in the military is included as a special memory of that time.
- 1950-59: Complete!1960-69: Complete!1970-79: Complete!
- 1980-89: Complete!
- 1990s: 1990-94 complete and the rest of the decade is being scanned.

While Chieftains are being posted from oldest to newest, the 1950, 1959 and 1965 yearbooks "jumped the line" thanks to the support of devoted Uni alumni:

- (3) Buying a download (PDF) of that yearbook and becoming a Presenter of that class yearbook (if available), shown on the top of the page indefinitely, for \$199.


More than a dozen books have been purchased already, and more are on the way!

Cross Country

The Uni varsity finished eighth in the 2016 Division II City Finals, scoring 199 points (19-39-40-49-52), led by senior *Jacob Abraham*, who finished 21st overall in 17:37.17 for the three-mile course.

Junior *Stephanie Cruz* finished fourth in the girls Division II Finals (19:41.72 for three miles), while Uni finished seventh as a team (174 points: 4-32-43-45-50). Cruz qualified for the State Division II Championships, held November 26 in Fresno, finishing 116th in 19:52.0.

• Girls/Tennis:

The Wildcats did not get invited to the City playoffs, despite finishing the season at 9-4 (8-4 in Western League matches), winning five of their last six matches. However, freshman *Olivia McIntosh-Adams* – who compiled a 7-0 singles record – has been invited to compete in the City's 32-player individual tennis tournament, starting November 28 at the Balboa Sports Center in Encino (results of her matches were not available at press time).

Girls/Volleyball:

Uni's City Division III champions advanced to the California State Division V playoffs and defeated Thousand Oaks Hillcrest Christian, 27-29, 26-24, 28-30, 25-13, 15-8 on November 16, but fell to top-ranked San Gabriel Academy, 21-25, 18-25, 25-23, 21-25 on November 19 in the Southern Regional quarterfinals.

A great season for coach *Emilio Alvarado's* Wildcats ended with an outstanding 22-8 record.

If you would like to see the plaques, please note that Uni is a closed school and one cannot simply walk onto campus. The best way to assure entry is to make arrangements with the school by calling (310) 914-3500 and ask to schedule a date to come to see the plaques.
