The strength of this program is that many of the books are student requests, based on their class assignments and interests. Uni librarian *Tascha Folsoi* '86 created the concept, using Amazon.com's "Wish List" program to list books desired for acquisition. Anyone can go to the list (*here*), purchase one or more books – four of the six supporters so far bought multiple books – and they will be sent to Uni directly within two business days.

The "University Senior High Library" Wish List enjoys Amazon Prime status thanks to Folsoi, so that you (as the purchaser) <u>do not</u> have to be an Amazon Prime member to buy any of the books!

Folsoi asks for help if you buy a book: "I think it would be better if we also asked people to email me their name and grad year along with items purchased, so I can email them back with the tax I.D. number and also remove the items from the list." INAUGURAL UNI FILM FESTIVAL SLATED FOR APRIL 28-29

Los Angeles is the long-time home of the U.S. entertainment industry and in the heyday of the Hollywood studios, Uni's was its favored high school, with alums such as *Jeff Bridges*, *Ryan O'Neal*, *Elizabeth Taylor* and *Norma Baker*, later known as Marilyn Monroe.

So Uni and the UHEF will partner this spring for the first UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL FILM FESTIVAL, over two nights in late April, at the renovated Stivelman Theater:

• Friday Apr. 28 4:00 p.m. Student Film Festival

• Saturday Apr. 29 6:00 p.m. Alumni reception and film screening

Friday's program will feature student films from Uni and other high schools, while the Saturday event will bring alumni together for a reception, selected reunions, a silent auction and the screening of a film with special meaning in Uni's history.

The Film Festival will replace the springtime All-Classes Picnic and Car Show, which was revived in May 2016, but – outside of the enthusiastic car owners – did not draw a significant crowd back to campus.

UNI ONLINE YEARBOOK PROJECT NEARING COMPLETION

After more than a year of planning and production efforts, a total of 66 school yearbooks are now online and viewable, free of charge, at www.uhef.org/unihighyearbooks.

This is a remarkable legacy achievement, created in conjunction with Uni's librarian, *Tascha Folsoi* '86. Nearly all of the yearbooks from 1924 – for what was them known as Wilson Jr. High School – through 1994 have been scanned, matched and uploaded. By decade:

- 1924-29: Missing 1928, but a copy has been offered by *Donald Grandfield* '59, which will be scanned and added as soon as possible.
- 1930-39: Missing 1934, for which a copy has been found and is now being scanned.
- 1940-49: Complete, although yearbooks were not produced for 1943 and 1944 due to paper rationing during World War II. A special scrapbook of Uni faculty and staff who served in the military is included as a special memory of that time.
- 1950-59: Complete!
 1960-69: Complete!
 1970-79: Complete!
- 1970-79: Complete!1980-89: Complete!
- 1990s: 1990-94 complete and the rest of the decade is being scanned.

While Chieftains are being posted from oldest to newest, the 1950, 1959 and 1965 yearbooks "jumped the line" thanks to the support of devoted Uni alumni:


