KAMPMANN REMEMBERED AT MEMORIAL SERVICE AT UNI

▶ More than 150 family, friends and former students and staff said goodbye to Uni's legendary coach, *Dick Kampmann*, at a memorial service on campus on February 4.

Kampmann passed away on January 24 at age 92 at his home in Santa Monica. While the burial was private, the memorial service was open to allow those who knew him to salute him one more time.

"Coach Richard Kampmann built champions from within," said *Ed Jackson* '71, who later

coached the track & field team at Venice High. "He provided training with knowledge and a role model for all who needed him. He taught us to value friendships and to work with each other toward achieving goals that seemed lofty at the time."

Pepperdine University cross country and track & field coach *Robert Radnoti*, who took over for Kampmann after he retired there in 2005, talked about Coach K as a role model in his 80s: "Great coaches are gifted with an ability to unlock what is bound up in others, and of course if they themselves could explain this gift, great coaching could be learned and perhaps we'd have more of them. I know many of you are great coaches and we have Richard Kampmann to thank for that. He modeled great coaching for us. He did not tell us how to coach. He simply modeled it."

The highlight of the program was an unexpected appearance by Kampmann's 1958 cross country captain from Dorsey High School: *Mike Love*, better known as a founding member of the Beach Boys. Close to Kampmann for decades after their time together, Love was scheduled to be in Houston for a Super Bowl LI party, but when the event was canceled, came to Uni to salute his high school coach.

Sharing some of his comments from the <u>Santa Monica Observer</u> about Kampmann, Love wrote, "Coach Kampmann's influence cannot be quantified. He touched so many lives of so many of us as young guys of varying degrees of talent. Even if you weren't the greatest runner. He made you feel like you were an Olympian."

Love also noted that the Beach Boys hit "Be True to Your School" was inspired by Coach K, but also – as he said at the service – "by the [Dorsey] cheerleaders."

The service included a homily from former Uni pole vaulter Rev. *Robert Acker* '74 of the Community Baptist Church of Rancho Cucamonga, hand-picked by Kampmann in 2014 to officiate at his funeral, as well as comments from Love, *Lenny Levine* '64, Jackson, San Pedro High School coach *Bruce Thomson*, who was mentored by Kampmann, Radnoti and, of course, son *Bill Stimming* and grandson *Christopher Stimming*.

A surprise guest brought by the Stimmings was Kampmann's legendary 1955 Ford Thunderbird convertible, parked in front of the Stivelman Theater for all to see, with many guests taking selfies of themselves with Coach's iconic car, that was usually parked on Rochester Avenue between Uni and Brockton Elementary School.

In accordance with the wishes of the family, a RICHARD M. KAMPMANN SCHOLARSHIP FUND has been established at Uni in coordination with the Uni Hi Education Foundation. 
Your donations will go into a fund which will provide an annual scholarship, awarded by the Kampmann Family in coordination with the Uni Hi Education Foundation.

With music by Jeanine Tesori, book and lyrics by David Lindsay-Abaire, "Shrek The Musical" is based on the Oscar-winning DreamWorks Animation film and the book Shrek by William Steig. The original Broadway production, starring Brian d'Arcy James as Shrek and Sutton Foster as Fiona, ran for twelve months and received a total of twelve Drama Desk Awards and eight Tony Award nominations, including Best Musical.

Uni's production is presented under the direction of Director of Theater Arts *Ronnie Sperling* '76 for four performances only, at the newly-remodeled Stivelman Theater on campus:

- [1] April 19: 3:30 p.m. ~ Student Preview Performance
- [2] April 20: 7:00 p.m. ~ Opening Night
- [3] April 21: 7:00 p.m. ~ Friday Night Showcase
- [4] April 22: 2:00 p.m. ~ Closing Matinee

Tickets for the April 19 show are priced at \$5, with an early-purchase price of just \$3 through April 6. Tickets for the April 20-21-22 shows are available at \$10 each, with VIP/First Row seats priced at \$15 each.

Tickets may be purchased online <u>here</u>, or at the Uni Student Store anytime prior to the show date or at the Stivelman Theater box office on the day of each show. The Stivelman Theater entrance is on Texas Avenue, mid-block between Westgate and Barrington Avenues. Ample street parking is available, with school lots on Barrington Avenue and Westgate Avenue both available as well.

He also is the treasurer for nonprofit that raises funds in the community to pay for programs and acquisitions at his local branch library. I am not only grateful for this ongoing support but also for the opportunity to network with our amazing alumni from Uni.

While I was not a great athlete, I still work out and remember the breathing pattern taught to me by our beloved Coach Kampmann that enabled me to run at a steady pace without stopping. Thank you to all of you for helping to keep the library running apace for our students today."

There were lots of pictures taken and hugs given, a few tears, and promises to see each other next year ... God Willing. CHECK OUT YOUR YEARBOOK: 77 CHIEFTAINS NOW ONLINE AT UHEF.ORG

▶ The permanent memorial to each Uni class is the annual *Chieftain* yearbook, produced continuously (with a two-year hiatus during World War II) since 1924. Some 77 of these, from 1924 through 2005 are now available online and viewable, free of charge, at <u>www.uhef.org/unihighyearbooks</u>.

Underwritten by the UHEF and funded by your donations, this project was coordinated with Uni's librarian, *Tascha Folsoi* '86. Work is continuing on a few missing years, but the collection is nearly complete:

- 1924-29: Missing 1928, but a copy has been offered by *Donald Grandfield* '59, which will be scanned and added as soon as possible.
- 1930-39: Missing 1934, for which a copy has been found and is now being scanned.
- 1940-49: Complete, although yearbooks were not produced for 1943 and 1944 due to paper rationing during World War II. A special scrapbook of Uni faculty and staff who served in the military is included as a special memory of that time.
- 1950-59: Complete!
- 1960-69: Complete!
- 1970-79: Complete!
- 1980-89: Complete!
- 1990-99: Complete!
- 2000s: Missing 2000 (we're not sure why), but 2001-05 are now available.

Special thanks are offered to three alumni who made donations to have their years posted more quickly and to help support the project: *Buddy Fischer* '50, *Larry Tistaert* '59 and *Steve Sills* '65.


