COLLINS & KATZ FAMILY YMCA NEARING COMPLETION AT UNI

► The exterior scaffolds have been removed and the interior work on the massive Collins & Katz Family YMCA is continuing with opening expected in April.

The work has been held back slightly because of the heavy rains in the area, but the pouring of the pools is continuing and the installation of the elegant copper roof is proceeding.

As noted by the project architects, Gonzalez Goodale, "the facility will provide 70,000 sq. ft. of athletic space including a rooftop running track, pool, and joint-use gym and locker rooms to be


shared with the neighboring Los Angeles Unified School District University High School."

Once complete and opened, Uni students will be able to use the facility during school hours, alongside the YMCA members, with underground parking available. The new facility, which replaces – and triples the size of – the Westside Family Y on Sawtelle Boulevard, continues a tradition of YMCA facilities on the Westside since 1941. You can see 30-second time-lapse video of the building process here.

Beyond the building itself, the partnership program is a critical element for the future. According to the YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles, "This partnership with LAUSD is a model for future collaborations of public, private, and non-profit organizations meeting the community's needs as public schools are reducing or eliminating youth programs and activities."

You can see the progress yourself by driving or walking by the construction site at the corner of Westgate and Ohio Avenues. It's impressive!

UNI PRODUCTION OF "SHREK THE MUSICAL" COMING APRIL 19



Uni's spring production brings "Shrek The Musical" to the Stivelman Theater for four performances only, beginning April 19th, 2017.

The family-friendly musical comedy follows the adventures of an ogre named Shrek who sets off on a quest to save Princess Fiona from a dragon. However, it turns out that in order to ultimately succeed, Shrek must battle an even bigger obstacle: learning how to believe in himself and open his heart to others.

The show is based on the Oscar-winning DreamWorks Animation film and the book *Shrek* by William Steig. The original Broadway production ran for twelve months and received a total of twelve Drama Desk Awards and eight Tony Award nominations, including Best Musical.

Uni's production is the latest hit from Uni Director of Theater Arts *Ronnie Sperling* '76 and will run for four days next month:

[1] April 19: 3:30 p.m. ~ Student Preview Performance

[2] April 20: 7:00 p.m. ~ Opening Night

[3] April 21: 7:00 p.m. ~ Friday Night Showcase

[4] April 22: 2:00 p.m. ~ Closing Matinee

Tickets for the April 19 show are priced at \$5, with an early-purchase price of just \$3 through April 6. Tickets for the April 20-21-22 shows are available at \$10 each, with VIP/First Row seats priced at \$15 each.

Tickets may be purchased online <u>here</u>, or at the Uni Student Store anytime prior to the show date or at the Stivelman Theater box office on the day of each show. The Stivelman Theater entrance is on Texas Avenue, mid-block between Westgate and Barrington Avenues. Ample street parking is available, with school lots on Barrington Avenue and Westgate Avenue both available as well.

CHECK OUT YOUR YEARBOOK: 77 CHIEFTAINS NOW ONLINE AT UHEF.ORG

The permanent memorial to each Uni class is the annual *Chieftain* yearbook, produced continuously (with a two-year hiatus during World War II) since 1924. Some 77 of these, from 1924 through 2005 are now available online and viewable, free of charge, at www.uhef.org/unihighyearbooks.

Underwritten by the UHEF and funded by your donations, this project was coordinated with Uni's librarian, *Tascha Folsoi* '86. Work is continuing on a few missing years, but the collection is nearly complete:

- 1924-29: Missing 1928, but a copy has been offered by *Donald Grandfield* '59, which will be scanned and added as soon as possible.
- 1930-39: Missing 1934, for which a copy has been found and is now being scanned.
- 1940-49: Complete, although yearbooks were not produced for 1943 and 1944 due to paper rationing during World War II. A special scrapbook of Uni faculty and staff who served in the military is included as a special memory of that time.
- 1950-59: Complete!
- 1960-69: Complete!
- 1970-79: Complete!
- 1980-89: Complete!
- 1990-99: Complete!
- 2000s: Missing 2000 (we're not sure why), but 2001-05 are now available.

Special thanks are offered to three alumni who made donations to have their years posted more quickly and to help support the project: **Buddy Fischer** '50, **Larry Tistaert** '59 and **Steve Sills** '65.



• Boys/Basketball:

Uni reached the semifinals of the City Division I playoffs before losing a heart-breaker in overtime to Granada Hills, 71-69, at the Roybal Learning Center gymnasium. The Wildcats, coached by *Steve Ackerman* '89, finished the season by winning four of its final six games.

Ackerman commented, "The 2016-2017 Uni Boys Varsity Basketball season was full of many individual and team triumphs. We began the season with a 13-game winning streak. That is the longest winning streak in the history of our Boys Varsity Basketball program. During that stretch, we won three holiday tournament championships: the El Monte Tournament, our own Jim Nakabara Classic, and the John F. Kennedy Cougar Classic. We were included on the 'watch list' for the City's Open Division of the Playoffs, reserved for only the top eight teams in the section and received glowing media notoriety in the Los Angeles Times and the local Internet blogs. We advanced to the L.A. City Section Division 1 semi-finals – the 'Final Four' – for the first time since 2011 by upsetting the no. 3 seed, Sylmar, before falling in overtime to Granada Hills. Uni ended its magical season one game short of the City Championship game with an impressive record of 21-10."

Agbasi led in rebounding at 6.1 per game and senior forward *Kevin Javier* had the most assists, at 4.1 per game.

UHEF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

- ▶ Did you know that the UHEF thanks to your donations supports these annual scholarships for Uni students:
 - *Community Service Scholarship*: \$1,000 awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni.

I still play a little tennis and enjoy my dear wife of 47 years, plus children. I saw Freddie Bartholomew on The Movie Channel – a great movie called "Captain's Courageous" with Spencer Tracy. And Anne Baxter too in the Razor's Edge; she was a date of Norman Allen, then the ROTC commander at Uni Hi. Baxter, Monetta Darnell, Richard Anderson, and Gail(?) were in several John Wayne movies...all credited in the 1942 graduation book. Those were the days my friends.
