UNI TO BE HONORED AS ONE OF THE TOP 20 SCHOOLS IN U.S. FOR "LIFE-CHANGING INSTRUCTION"

▶ Uni principal *Eric Davidson* received this message on Tuesday, May 9:

"The International Education Bureau of the nationally recognized Walt Disney Motif Awards has ranked University High School as one of the top twenty schools in the country to exceptionally expose students to high levels of life-changing instruction.

"Because of your push to generate positive productive citizens within our nation; the Walt Disney Motif Awards International Selections Committee has elected to honor the University High School during the 2017 Walt Disney Motif Awards Ceremony, 'The Nation's Highest Most Prestigious Honor For Youth Advocacy.'

"The Ceremony will be observed on Sunday September 10, 2017, 8:00 PM (PST) at the distinguished Walt Disney Concert Hall of Downtown Los Angeles, California."

It's a remarkable honor for Uni, as the <u>Motif Awards</u> program is "to promote and support the local and global community through optimum education and development of youth and to influence and honor the professional growth of educators, and others who are committed to the needs of children in a changing society."

Uni was selected directly by the Motif Awards board; the school did not apply for the award. It was awarded, in part, because of Uni's remarkable increase in its graduation rate in recent classes.

Davidson noted that "in the past several years we have been able to turn the graduation-rate stereotype on its head." For the 2015-16 school year, Uni <u>compiled an enviable record</u> of a 90.8% graduation rate for its senior class, including this breakdown by ethnicity:

•	African-American:	78/81	96.3%
•	Hispanic:	200/219	91.3%
•	Asian-American:	32/36	88.9%
•	White:	26/34	76.5%

By comparison, Uni's senior-class grad rate in 2009-10? A much more modest 74.8%.

To recognize the achievement, the entire Uni faculty and staff team is invited to the ceremony in September. Congratulations!

THANKS TO ALL WHO ATTENDED "GREASE" TO RAISE FUNDS FOR UNI THEATER

An enthusiastic crowd of parents, students and friends of Uni attended the April 29 fundraiser for Uni Theater Arts highlighted by the showing of the Sing-A-Long version of "Grease."

In addition to the movie were costume and dance contests under the direction of Uni's own **Ronnie Sperling** '76. "The dance contest was a lot of fun. We had 20-25 kids on stage and played Willie and the Hand Jive.' We demonstrated what the Hand Jive was – a 1950s dance – and they all learned it and did it!

"We also went into the audience and had a 'Grease' trivia contest and gave out lots of prizes. That included some gift certificates that were donated by Café '50s, which was founded by a Uni alum."

The program, which was primarily an experiment to see if this kind of program could be organized successfully, ran smoothly and earned about \$500 for the Uni Theater Arts program. Next year: bigger and better!

• Boys/Baseball:

Uni won four of its last five regular-season games to finish 11-12 and 7-5 in the Western League. The Wildcats play all of their games on the road due to a lack of a facility on or near the Uni campus, but were seeded 20th in the City's Division I playoffs and won a play-in game against Granada Hills, 3-1, on May 11. Uni, now 12-12, will play fourth-seeded San Pedro on May 16 at 3 p.m. Uni's MaxPreps schedule and statistics are <u>here</u>.

• Boys/Golf:

Eric Temena's squad of all underclassmen was the second-best team in the Western League during the regular season, and proved it again in the League Finals as runner-up to LACES, 451-497. Uni had four players in the top 12 in the 18-hole Western League Finals: junior Vishal Vinodh, fifth (91); junior Lawrence Kim, eighth (92); freshman Noah Flournoy, 10th (97) and soph Anuv Gupta, 12th (98).

• Boys/Tennis:

The Wildcats finished 4-9 overall and 4-6 in the Western League, with wins over Venice. Westchester and two over LACES. For scores and schedule, click *here*.

• Boys/Volleyball:

Uni's volleyball squad ended its season with a 20-13-1 record and 5-5 in the Western

League, finishing the regular season with nine wins in its last 11 games. But the Wildcats lost in the opening Division I playoff round to Bravo, three sets to none. Scores and schedule are *here*.

Girls/Softball:

The softballers are 6-10 overall and had a 4-8 mark in the Western League, with wins over Fairfax, Westchester (2) and LACES. Uni, seeded no. 1 in the City's Division IV playoff bracket, won their first game, vs. Elizabeth HS, 11-1, on May 11. The Wildcats will next play Jefferson today at 3 p.m. For scores and schedules, click *here*.

Uni competed in the Western League finals the week of May 11 and qualifiers will compete in the City Prelims at Birmingham High School on May 18 and the City Finals at El Camino College on May 25.

UHEF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

- ▶ Did you know that the UHEF thanks to your donations supports these annual scholarships for Uni students:
 - *Community Service Scholarship*: \$1,000 awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni.
 - Jack Moskowitz Principal's Award: Named for one of Uni's most outstanding

principals (1984-93), a \$1,000 award to a graduating senior selected by Uni Principal *Eric Davidson* for exceptional achievement and service to the school.

- ▶ We noted these passings:
 - John Reynolds Van Atta '57 (1939-2017) <u>passed</u> on May 16 at age 76. Born in Winchester, Massachusetts, he attended Emerson Junior High School, where he met his eventual wife *Pamela Kreis*. After finishing at Uni, he graduated from U.C. Santa Barbara in 1962 and then earned a Ph.D. in Biophysics from the University of Michigan.

He came back to Los Angeles to join Carnation and then moved to Kenilworth, Illinois to work for Quaker Oats, where he was a member of the executive leadership team and supervised research and development. He retired after eight years in Illinois, and returned to California to Santa Barbara. Passionate about golf, piano playing, and wine making, he was one of five neighbors who created the wine label Los Cinco Locos.

- Peter Choate '58 (1941-2017) passed on March 31 at his home in Sullivan Canyon. He attended Uni and Stanford, where he was a All-American in golf, competed barefoot at times, set an amateur course record of 66 at Cypress Point and met his wife Patti. Although he briefly considered joining the PGA Tour, he pursued a career in architecture, founding Choate Associates Architects in 1971 and specializing in residential design. Most of Peter's work is located in California, but he also built homes and small hotels for clients in New Mexico, Wyoming, and Maryland. Peter's legacy lives on in the beautiful architecture that he created and left us all to enjoy.
- Larry Porter '50 reports that fellow Alohan Beverly (DeVoe) Snell (1933-2017) died this past April.

Our condolences to all of the family and friends of our departed Warriors and Wildcats.

Although Uni will complete its 93rd academic year as a Los Angeles School District high school in June, the graduation ceremony will actually mark the 92nd class to finish at Uni. Although the first academic year for what was then known as Warren G. Harding High School was in 1924-25, there was no senior class.

Instead, the oldest students on campus were the 11th-grade class of 40 boys and 38 girls, which went on to become the school's first graduating class ... of 1926!
