UHEF AWARDS FOUR SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS

▶ One of the most rewarding activities of the Uni Hi Education Foundation is to honor seniors with special scholarship awards made possible by alumni donations. This year, four seniors received UHEF recognition at a special on-campus awards ceremony on May 24:

JACK MOSKOWITZ PRINCIPAL'S AWARD:

Named in honor of the late Uni Principal (1984-93) and awarded to a deserving senior selected by Uni Principal Eric Davidson:

Gia Gershon-Friedberg

All four scholarship awards were for \$1,000. Although one Community Service award is normally given, the UHEF Board was so impressed by the service efforts of both Im and Suzukawa and voted for two awards to be given this year.

The awards were presented to Im and Suzukawa by Uni Class of 1976 alum, UHEF Board member and Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, Ronnie Sperling. Uni Principal Davidson awarded Gershon-Friedberg with her award. Unfortunately, Marcial could not attend the ceremony and received her award separately.

UNI COACH AND TEACHER DUANE LARUE PASSES AT 81

▶ Longtime Uni teacher, coach and legend *Duane LaRue* passed away on May 8 at age 81.

Born in Los Angeles in 1935, he graduated from Washington High School and went to Pepperdine College – as it was known then – on a football scholarship. He came to Uni for the 1962-63 school year as a physical education teacher and the co-coach for football and coach for gymnastics.

He had a long and successful career at Uni, which included making the gymnastics program one of the best in the City, winning the 1970 All-City team championship. He continued at Uni for 32 academic years and finally retired as Physical Education department chairman and Athletic Director at the close of the 1993-94 academic year.

Did you know that during his early years of teaching he was also a part-time scout for the Los Angeles Rams?

LaRue was a popular figure on campus despite an outwardly gruff demeanor. He demanded effort and excellence at all levels and from everyone he worked with, but with a sense of humor – if you weren't too scared to let it come out over time – that endeared him to many. In 1987, he was presented with an Apple Award for teaching excellence by Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley.

Coach LaRue retired to his home in Saugus, but suffered a serious fall from the roof of his house in 2003 and suffered lasting injuries to his memory.

Art Maeda '67 (5thsettennis@gmail.com) wrote that "Coach La Rue was a patient coach even

if you weren't that good of an athlete. We used to call him 'The Machine.' I was on his gymnastics team from 1964-1967. Coach LaRue was the only teacher I could remember. R.I.P. Coach we will remember you."

Gary Lynch, W '68 (<u>garylynch0801@gmail.com</u>) wrote "I played football for Coach LaRue from '65–'67. I wasn't the best player for sure and I can remember several times when he yelled at me, really to encourage me to do better. I always respected him and he remains one of my favorite memories of my time at Uni."

Wayman Ricks (*wlricks@yahoo.com*) added: "I am of the class of '82 and will always remember his enthusiasm when I played football. When we played away games you would always here his call for the 'Rooter Bus!' I am so sorry to hear about his passing. Thank you coach LaRue for being a part of my high school experience. My condolences to your family."

JACOB ABRAHAM: FROM ERITREAN ROOTS TO THE IVY LEAGUE

▶ Uni's mission is to educate, inspire and prepare young people to take the next step in their lives. Its success, as noted by the naming of University High School as one of the top-20 schools in the United States by the International Education Bureau of the nationally-recognized Walt Disney Motif Awards (*see our previous issue*), is further underscored by the remarkable story of senior Jacob Abraham.

His achievements were profiled in the <u>L.A. Unified School District's daily report on May 19</u>, including:

"[He enrolled] in University High's most rigorous college preparatory classes, including honors and Advanced Placement courses. He also played cello in the school orchestra and was selected to participate in University's Peer Mediation program. He ran track for the Uni Wildcats and was captain of the cross-country team.

"Thanks to his 4.3 grade-point average and varied extracurricular activities, Abraham was accepted to 13 universities, including Brown University, Princeton University, Northwestern University, the University of Pennsylvania, University of California Los Angeles and the University of Southern California.

"He has accepted the offer from Brown to enroll in its eight-year Program in Liberal Medical Education, which guarantees students admission to medical school after they complete their undergraduate degree. He plans to become a cardiologist or radiologist, fulfilling his lifelong dream of becoming a doctor.

"His acceptance to college also fulfills the dreams of his mother, an immigrant from the East African country of Eritrea."

Isn't that what we all hope for for Uni's students? Congratulations to Jacob and the Class of 2017 Wildcats moving on to colleges across the nation.

• Boys/Baseball:

Uni won four of its last five regular-season games to finish 11-12 and 7-5 in the Western League. The Wildcats play all of their games on the road due to a lack of a facility on or near the Uni campus, but were seeded 20th in the City's Division I playoffs and won a play-in game against Granada Hills, 3-1, on May 11, but lost to San Pedro on May 16 to finish at 12-13 overall. • Girls/Softball:

★ ALL-CITY DIVISION IV CHAMPIONS! ★

Coach *Jason Tillett* and his softballers finished their regular 6-10 overall and had a 4-8 mark in the Western League, with wins over Fairfax, Westchester (2) and LACES.

Uni was seeded no. 1 in the City's Division IV playoff bracket, and won all four of its games to become City Champions!

The Wildcats clubbed, in order, Elizabeth HS, 11-1; Jefferson, 14-4; Triumph Charter, 15-0 and won the title over Rivera HS, 10-3, at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

For the season, Uni batted .301 as a team and was led by sophomore infielder **Belen Ferra** (.389), senior catcher **Jessica Sanchez** (.379), senior infielder **Joanna Amaya** (.362) and junior outfielder and pitcher **Jesenia Sanchez** (.340). Ferra led in home runs with three and Jessica Sanchez had 21 runs batted in for tops on the team. The top pitchers were junior **Liliana Garcia**, who had a 5-4 record and an 3.69 earned-run average in 11 appearances, and Jesenia Sanchez: 15 appearances and an excellent 3.14 ERA, but a 1-5 overall record.

Tillett was honored as Division IV *Coach of the Year*; Jessica Sanchez was *Player of the Year*; Jesenia Sanchez was honored as *Pitcher of the Year* and Amaya and freshman infielder *Abelina Nunez* were named to the All-City Division IV First Team.
