UNI FACULTY & STAFF HONORED AT THE 2017 DISNEY MOTIF AWARDS

- ▣ A remarkable honor for University High School and its faculty and staff was celebrated at the 2017 Disney Motif Awards at the Walt Disney Concert Hall in downtown Los Angeles on Sunday, September 10, 2017.

Billed as the “Nation’s Highest Honor for Child Advocacy,” the Scholastics Medal Honor was presented to three Los Angeles schools: Granada Hills Charter, Los Angeles Center for Enriched Studies and University High School.

The entire Uni faculty was invited to the event, as were members of the Uni Hi Education Foundation. Principal **Eric Davidson** accepted the award on behalf of the entire Uni team, of which many were present at the ceremony:



Other honorees included **Lloyd Morrisett**, founder of the Sesame Street Workshop, for the Lifetime Legacy Award; performer **Jaleel White** from the situation comedy “Family Matters” for the Global Humanitarian Award, and **Mallory Lewis** for the Advancement of Education Award for continuing Lamb Chop’s Play Along, the famed PBS pre-school program originated by her mother, **Shari Lewis**.

MORE RESPONSES ON UNI’S ALMA MATER

- ▣ We continue to receive comments on Uni’s school song (lyrics and other cheers [here](#)), which was sung to the music of the “Emperor’s Hymn” by the Austrian composer, Franz Joseph Haydn in 1797. The same piece was designated as the [German National Anthem](#) in 1922 and has been ever since. It was infamously used by the Nazi regime with the words of the first stanza, “Deutschland, Deutschland Uber Alles,” but now uses the third stanza only.

Barbara Wong W ‘68 Salesians (wong.barbara16@gmail.com) wrote “*I respectfully disagree with [Mark Rosen ‘64’s comment] that there wasn’t a following. For me, it was part of the*

fabric of high school life then.. sang at every football game.. at assemblies. In today's world ... maybe old fashioned ... but a sad loss of a tradition!"

As noted last issue, the Alma Mater is not in use at Uni today; it faded from interest in the mid 1970s and was phased out – as far as can be remembered – by 1975.

UHEF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

- **Community Service Scholarship:** \$1,000 awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni.
 - **Jack Moskowitz Principal's Award:** Named for one of Uni's most outstanding principals (1984-93), a \$1,000 award to a graduating senior selected by Uni Principal **Eric Davidson** for exceptional achievement and service to the school.

- ▣ A Uni alum who made a major impact on high school sports in Southern California has passed; special thanks to **Carolyn Sausser Lynch** S '49 (CLynch522@aol.com) and **Jim Rosvall** S '59 (jtrosvall@gmail.com) for sending us notes on this:

Jerry Marvin Jr., S'48, the long-time basketball coach at Palisades High School, passed at age 87 on [August 27](#), after a long illness. He was the son of **Jerry Marvin**, who taught and coached at Uni from 1931 to 1962, and who led Uni to its only City basketball title in 1954.

Marvin Jr. went to UCLA after his time at Uni and became the coach at Bell High School in 1955 and then at Palisades in 1961 and continued for the next 30 years. During that time, he also had one City title team, in 1969, and coached NBA stars such as **Kiki Vandeweghe** and **Steve Kerr**.

In an April 1991 feature in the [Los Angeles Times](#) about his retirement, he decried the changes which had come into the game during his tenure at Pali:

“Marvin, who has coached at Palisades since the school opened in 1961, said he is leaving not because he no longer loves the game, but because the game – and athletics in general – has gotten out of control.

“The only thing I've been crazy about is basketball,” said Marvin, 61, who led the 1969 Palisades team to a Los Angeles City championship and finished with a career record of 284-130 at the school.

“But he said that something has gone terribly wrong with basketball when high school coaches have to resort to recruiting players in order to compete and high school players think they are going to play their way into million-dollar professional contracts.”

Marvin Jr. is survived by his wife, Gaelyn, a son and a daughter and two grandchildren.

"Much as I might like to, I won't be heading to SoCal for Uni events, but I want to keep connected."

*"My brother **Tom (Thomas) Allen** graduated from Uni in June '46, passed away in '91, having served in Korea, become an LA deputy sheriff, and the father of 7."*

*"I graduated in W '50, eventually took my teaching certificate from Claremont Grad. School (having graduated from Pomona in '55), and moved to Oakland where I continued teaching, met my husband, **Jim Gayner**, had three children (who've all moved to Oregon). Received my ESL certification from UC Berkeley and taught in the East Bay, China, and where Jim and I currently live and love it, here in Eureka. Email anyone?"*

- ▣ A remembrance of Coach **Duane LaRue**, who passed on May 8 at age 81 ([more here](#)) from **Mike Custer** '75 (mikep.custer@gmail.com). Custer wrote movingly about his experience with LaRue at Uni in the [2005 UHEF Annual Newsletter](#) (see page 13) and adds these final memories:

"It has now been 44 or so years since our introduction. I am now about 20 years older than he was when we met. The story and the memories haven't changed."

"I saw him several times a year for the last forty years. At the close of every visit he would confirm that I would come back again. The answer was always, 'Yes.' I visited him in his hospital room just a short time before his passing. As I stood to leave, he again wanted confirmation that I would come back again. That 'Yes' turned out to be the last one he would hear from me. In a faint voice he added, 'and bring your bicycle.' The bicycle was in reference to an old bicycle built for two that I used to ride to Uni and at Uni with him on the front pedaling and me on the back just along for the ride. His humor was with him to the end. The story and the memories haven't changed."

- ▣ The massive plaques saluting Coach **Dick Kampmann**, Uni sprinter (and double Olympic gold medalist) **Mel Patton** '43 and the school's first principal, **Angus Cavanaugh**, are mounted outside the north side of the South Gym.
