CHANGE IS COMING: UNI PROPOSED TO BECOME AN "AFFILIATED CHARTER SCHOOL"

 "[D]espite its academic, community partnership, and facility revitalization achievements, University High has experienced decreasing enrollment: as an increasing number of community families elect to send their high-school age students to nearby affiliated charter and independent charter high schools. To better compete with these schools, and offer parents

and students a premier, comprehensive K-12 community-based affiliated charter public school option, University High must evolve into a community charter high school affiliated with the public school system of the Los Angeles Unified School District."

That statement, on page 9 of the <u>draft Charter document</u>, sets out the key driver to change Uni from a School-Based Management program to an affiliated charter school within the Los Angeles Unified School District. The statistics show the unsustainable path that Uni's enrollment is on:

- 2012-13: 1,897
- 2013-14: 1,804
- 2014-15: 1,763
- 2015-16: 1,671 Four-year change: -11.9%

By contrast, Palisades Charter is up 3.1% over the same period to 2,970 students and New West, another independent charter, has increased its enrollment from 573 to 823 (+43.6%) over the last four years.

Three of Uni's key feeder schools – Emerson Middle School, Paul Revere Middle School and Westwood Elementary School – are affiliated charter schools, another key driver for the change.

"[A]ttendance data shows that a large number of students who attend District-affiliated charter schools at the elementary school level (such as Westwood Charter School) or at the middle school level (such as [Emerson] Middle School) leave these schools, or do not advance to the next school in the chain, because the charter programs to which they are accustomed do not continue past the middle school level."

The proposed Charter documents outline a carefully-designed "Academic Pathways' program which starts with a "First Year Conservatory" course of study for ninth-graders and then continues students in one of three divisions:

- Communications, Entrepreneurship and Law
- Creative Arts
- Health Care and Fitness

These programs are carefully aligned with the curriculum already in place at Emerson and Revere.

The major change in the way the school is operated is that a University High Council will be able to set the "policies, procedures and regulations for the governance" of the school, including decisions concerning the "funds and finances of University High for the benefit of its students." The 20-member Council, who would generally serve two-year terms, would be made up of:

- 1: The Uni Principal;
- 10: Teachers, who must be members of the United Teachers Los Angeles union, with

nine elected by Faculty Committee members, plus the UTLA Chapter Chair;

- 4: Parents, who would be elected by the parents of Uni students;
- 1: Community representative, to be appointed by the Uni Hi Education Foundation (UHEF);
- 2: Students, including the Student Body President and one other member to be elected by the student body;
- 1: Non-teacher employee of the school, appointed by the Principal and UTLA Chapter Chair;
- 1: At-Large, appointed by the District or the Principal.

Students living in Uni's traditional "boundaries" within the LAUSD would be able to attend the school automatically, but students from anywhere could apply to go to Uni and if too many apply, a lottery would be used to select students up to the school's capacity.

The process is just beginning and Uni held a community meeting on November 8 to introduce the draft proposal and answer questions. The school has a Web page devoted to this topic <u>here</u>.

"GROWING HUNGRY FOR CHANGE" COMING TO UNI ON NOV. 26

▶ The *Growing Hungry for Change* project's mission is to support tools that improve access to nutritious food and create more food secure communities. Uni is supporting this with a

Growing Hungry for Change event on campus on November 26, from 12:00-2:30 p.m. at the amphitheater in the middle of campus (near the old Girls' Gym).

The program will be led by Uni students under the direction of *Kerri Eich*, the leader of Uni's health programs. She described the event in detail:

"We will be connecting plants and their health benefits to simple solutions that support easier access to nourishing food. Our first event will teach participants how to build their own food tower. Chefs will work with us to prepare a healthy meal from our recipe book, and we will give away plants while we teach about their health benefits.

"This is a free event and you can register online at <u>www.growinghungryforchange.com</u>. We want our community to be part of this unique experience and support our mission to better understand how plants support one's health. If you would like to take home a solar powered drip tower you build at the event, you can do so for \$20.00.

"We will teach our community about companion planting, how to build your own tower from scrap materials, health benefits of integrating plants into your diet, how to shop and prepare meals for a sustainable budget, and the importance of having a balanced diet."

In addition, Eich is coordinating a West Los Angeles Neighborhood Council community cleanup program at Uni on Saturday, November 18 as part of the Clean Streets L.A. community beautification initiative. Interested volunteers can meet at the Barrington & Texas parking lot at 8 a.m. and the program will be completed by noon. Refreshments and "other surprises" are promised.

BOFFO TURNOUT FOR "THE 25th ANNUAL PUTNAM COUNTY SPELLING BEE"

Uni's presentation of "The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee" was another triumph, even over some technical glitches at the last performance, reports Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie Sperling* '76:

"Our final show on November 9th was nearly sold out. Audiences went bananas over this one at *EVERY* performance, but this night was special and made Uni history. Just a couple of minutes into the show, the computer that runs the more than 200 light cues... *CRASHED*.

"I calmly made the executive decision to halt the show. I told the audience we were having technical difficulties and would restart shortly. House lights up, and pre-show music came back on. Reboot.

"Less than 5 minutes later we fixed the problem and started over. Now what happened after the 'glitch' was pure magic. The beauty of *LIVE* theatre!! The cast and crew handled everything like professionals. Now the audience knew they were really attending an extremely special evening.

• Boys/Football:

Uni finished 2-8 in the regular season (0-5 Western League) and was seeded 12th in the City Division II playoffs. The game against no. 5 Bell was supposed to start at 7 p.m. on November 9, but Uni's bus sat in traffic for four hours because of a malfunctioning train!

• Cross Country:

Uni has had some success on the roads, finishing in the top three in the Western League

in all three boys and girls divisions this season, and qualifying both varsity teams for the Division II <u>City Finals on November 18</u> at Pierce College, starting at 8 a.m. In addition, two individual Wildcats will be competing in the Frosh/Soph City Finals and the girls junior varsity qualified as a team.

(Qualifying for the City Finals is different for Varsity teams than for Junior Varsity or Frosh/Soph. The top four teams from each League Finals qualify for the City Prelims and then the top four teams in each heat and the next three fastest by "team time" move on to the City Finals. The top 10 teams by aggregate "team time" – of its top five finishers – from the various League Finals qualify directly to the City Finals for the Junior Varsity and Frosh/Soph divisions.)

Boys:

The Uni varsity finished third in the five-team Western League, scoring 80 points, behind Palisades (15) and Venice (62). The top Uni finishers were senior **Nathan Lam** in seventh (16:42.11 for three miles) and senior **Jack Koscheka** in 10th (17:49.27). Uni finished fifth in the City Prelims and will be in the City Finals on November 18 at Pierce College; Lam ran 17:19.06 for third in the heat, with Koscheka 14th in 17:43.30.

The junior varsity was also third (75), behind Palisades (18) and Venice (45), with *Sebastian Hernandez* the top Wildcat finisher in 15th (21:15.71). The JVs did not qualify for the City Finals.

The frosh/soph team was third, scoring 62 points to 61 for Hamilton and 18 for Palisades. Uni had one top-10 finisher in sophomore *Aaron Fuentes*, who timed 17:39.68 for the three-mile course in Elysian Park. Fuentes qualified for the City Finals as an individual.

Girls:

Stephanie Cruz Beltran (20:22.18) finished ninth in the girls varsity division as Uni was third behind Palisades (15) and Hamilton (65). Uni qualified for the City Division II finals with a fourth-place finish in the City Prelims, with **Cruz Beltran** finishing fifth and **Claire Hafteck** in 12th.

The girls junior varsity was second to Palisades (20-43), with senior **Dejah Johnson** finishing fourth in 23:23.43 for three miles, senior **Alex Parker** seventh (24:23:24) and senior **Hannah Schoenberg** ninth (25:28.71). The team qualified for the City Finals.

Uni was third to Pali (15) and Hamilton (67) in the girls frosh/soph division, scoring 73 points and led by soph *Ce'Arion Turner* (22:25.96). Turner qualified for the City Finals as an individual.

• *Girls/Golf:*

Senior Kara Temena finished fifth in the Los Angeles City Golf Championships, shooting

a 77 for 18 holes and qualified for the CIF State Regionals in Riverside. Unfortunately, her score of 83 (+10) placed her only 65th and she did not qualify for the State Championships.

Her father, Eric, who has resurrected Uni's golf programs reported that while Kara "is disappointed that she will not be going to State and that she is done with high school golf. However, she is very happy knowing that she started and captained the first-ever girls golf team at UNI and hopes that the team goes on."

• Girls/Tennis:

Uni lost a final playoff match to Venice, 6-1, to close the season at 3-12 overall and 3-10 in the Western League. For Uni's scores, schedule and stats on *MaxPreps.com*, <u>click here</u>.

• Girls/Volleyball:

The Wildcats finished 13-13 and 7-5 in Western League play, then swept Kennedy, 3-0, in the first round of the City Division II playoffs, but lost to Verdugo Hills, 3-0, to finish at 14-14 overall. Uni's scores, schedule and stats on *MaxPreps.com*, <u>click here</u>.

Your help is greatly appreciated!"

Ackerman has a special Alumni Basketball Day coming up on November 18, with three games scheduled:

- 4:00 p.m.: Boys Junior Varsity vs. Boys Frosh/Soph team
- 5:30 p.m.: Girls Varsity vs. Alumnae
- 7:00 p.m.: Boys Varsity vs. Alumni
