NOT LIKE THE OLD DAYS: UNI'S ATTENDANCE DECLINE

▶ As noted in our <u>November 15</u> issue, Uni is working toward a new status as a community charter high school (more details <u>here</u>) in significant part because of declining enrollment.

The draft outline of the proposed Affiliated Charter program notes in part, "[D]espite its academic, community partnership, and facility revitalization achievements, University High has experienced decreasing enrollment: as an increasing number of community families elect to send their high-school age students to nearby affiliated charter and independent charter high schools." In fact, the downturn has been dramatic:

Uni is not alone in this situation, for example when compared with its Western League (past and present) brethren for the 2016-17 school year:

(Westchester's second magnet is not tracked by the <u>*California School Dashboard*</u> statistics service, so its enrollment is understated above.)

It's a long way from Uni's historical enrollment, which peaked at nearly 4,000 in 1960-61 (prior to the opening of Palisades in the fall of 1961) and was typically around 3,000 for grades 10-12 in the 1970s. Over the *past 30 years*:

Uni expanded to four grades -9 to 12 - in 1995-96 after decades of hosting grades 10-12 since 1938-39, so the decrease is even more noticeable.

• Boys/Football:

Uni bowed out of the City Division II playoffs with a 47-27 loss to Cleveland on November 17, but the game was not without highlights for the Wildcats. Senior receiver *Kareem Miles* completed his Uni career with three touchdowns, including a 99-yard kickoff return and five receptions for 197 yards and two scores. Junior quarterback *Alex Atmadjian* completed 13-17 passes for 298 yards and two touchdowns and added 59 yards rushing with one score ... but also suffered three interceptions. Junior linebacker *Carlos Lucas* added 10 tackles on defense and Miles had an interception.

Thus, Uni ended the year at 3-9 overall, but on an upbeat note with a playoff win under trying circumstances at Bell and a strong performance against Cleveland. The schedule (* = Western League game):

The Wildcats are being led in scoring by soph 6-3 forward *David Cheatom*, averaging 21.5 points per game (and 7.5 rebounds per), followed by 6-0 senior guard *Daisone Hughes* at 20.5 and 6-2 senior guard *Richard Wilson Jr.* at 18.8 and a team-high 8.5 rebounds per game.

Uni has its home opener against Price on December 1 at 6 p.m. in the South Gym and then hosts the *Jim Nakabara Classic* from December 4-8, with the Wildcats to play Los Angeles on December 4; Marshall on December 6 and Cleveland on December 7, all at 7 p.m. The championship game will be played on December 8 ... will Uni be in it?

Ackerman is asking for alumni financial support for the team through a <u>GoFundMe</u> campaign. He notes that "Due to tremendous budget cuts to education in the State of California and within our school district, and further suffocating restrictions for how some funds are spent, the budget for prep athletics has been decimated.

"We need to fund-raise annually for our program just to maintain its infrastructure. Whether it is for the purchase of new uniforms, or replacement of damaged ones, new or replacement sports equipment (basketballs, athletic tape, first aid supplies, etc.), maintenance of the basketball facilities (courts, backboards, rims, nets), or entry fees for seasonal tournaments, it is an annual struggle to fund the necessities for our three teams (Varsity, J.V. & Frosh/Soph). Your help is greatly appreciated!"

• Boys/Soccer:

Uni has started 3-1, losing to San Pedro (2-1), but defeating Van Nuys 1-0), Los Angeles (forfeit) and Valley Academy of Arts & Sciences (6-1). Western League play starts Dec. 6 vs. Venice at Kampmann Stadium. See Uni's upcoming schedule, scores and statistics on *MaxPreps.com <u>here</u>*.

• Cross Country:

Uni qualified three teams into the City Finals on November 18, with modest results:

- Uni's boys Varsity finished 10th (out of 11 teams) in the Division II finals with 243 points. The top Uni finisher was senior *Nathan Lam* in 23rd at 17:39.84 for the three-mile course at Pierce College. Bravo Medical Magnet won the division title with 40 points and *Daniel Morales* of Bravo won the race in 15:43.98.
- In the girls Division II Varsity final, Uni finished seventh (out of 11) with 174 points, led by seniors *Stephanie Cruz Beltran* (10th, 20:56.62) and *Claire Hafteck* (27th, 22:05.56), also on the three-mile course. *Valerie Zavala* of Granada Hills won the individual title (19:14.55) and Canoga Park won the division team title with 70 points.

- Uni finished ninth in the girls Junior Varsity final with 245 points, led by senior Dejah Johnson, who finished 30th in 24:13.83.
- In the Frosh/Soph finals, Uni had individual qualifiers in each race. Sophomore Aaron Fuentes finished 45h in 18:58.08 in the boys race and soph Ce'Arion Turner was 60th in 25:46.90.

A LOOK BACK AT LOS ANGELES OF THE 1940s-50s-60s IN "WESTSIDE STORIES"

▶ The Helms Bakery trucks. Drive-in theaters and Drive-in restaurants. S&H Green Stamps.


These were all part of Los Angeles life in the middle of the 20th century, when the area expanded from the home of Hollywood to being the capital of America's West Coast in the aftermath of World War II.

This period, so fondly remembered by so many, is captured in a unique book, *Westside Stories*, by *Michael Harris*, which profiles the area and connects the decades that made Los Angeles the world leader it is today: the 1940s, 1950s and 1960s.

While Harris himself went to Hamilton, the book concentrates on the Westside as it changed, grew and prospered. People and places we remember are there: the Pan Pacific Auditorium, Gilmore Field, the Ambassador Hotel, and many more. Even a one-time Uni student named *Norma Baker*, who became better known as *Marilyn Monroe*.

▶ How's Uni's first NBA player, *David Nwaba* '11 doing with the Chicago Bulls?

Not so hot, unfortunately. The Bulls are the worst team in the NBA, with a 3-15 record. Nwaba played in eight games – starting three – before <u>spraining his right ankle</u> on November 4, an injury which has kept him out of action up until now. He hopes to start practicing again soon, as he is near the end of the healing process.

For the season, Nwaba, now 24, is averaging 6.9 points per game, 5.5 rebounds a game and shooting 52.6% from the floor and 72.2% from the free-throw line. He had his season highs of 16 points on November 3 at Orlando and 11 rebounds against Atlanta at home on October 26.
