### ▶ What's a "grad-year" donation?

It's a modest <u>donation</u> in the amount of the year of your graduation from Uni. If you graduated in 1950, it would be \$19.50. If you're a new graduate, \$20.17.

That's all it takes to make a *major difference* in the education and opportunities offered to Uni students as the second semester gets ready to start next Monday.

Earlier this year, Uni principal *Eric Davidson* wrote about the challenge of educating young people in today's uncertain environment. He noted, in part:

"The youth of today are in survival mode. The competition is greater than it has ever been and society has been giving trophies to everyone who participates for far too long. It's not enough to participate anymore and we have to make sure we are preparing students to vie against a greater number of capable competitors.

"This cannot be the work of school staff and current parents alone. The Uni nation has to come to our aid. Public education is free – great public education costs a little more. The three resources schools use are human, financial, and time."

The Uni Hi Education Foundation has raised a little more than \$1.1 million since its formation in 1985, an average of a little less than \$35,000 a year. That's not that much, folks. But we keep trying.

There are approximately 16,906 people on the UHEF mailing list, of which 87% have NEVER donated. This Warriors & Wildcats Report is circulated to 6,230 subscribers, of which 98% have NEVER given.


## WHAT SHOULD BE OUR NEXT STEP TO BRING ALUMNI BACK TO CAMPUS?

## MARK YOUR CALENDAR: "GREASE" OPENS ON APRIL 18

Uni's upcoming production of *Grease* is being widely anticipated on campus, in the 40th anniversary year of the iconic film.

There's good reason why the student body is excited about it: the show is one of the most popular musicals in production across the country. Although originally written in Chicago in 1971, with specific ethnic references to that city, it is best known from Paramount's <u>1978 film</u> that starred *John Travolta* and *Olivia Newton-John* as Danny Zuko and Sandy Olsson (Sandy Dumbrowski in the musical) in their senior years at fictional Rydell High School.

Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie Sperling* '76 notes that the upcoming production will reflect the <u>original</u>, <u>edgy musical</u> by **Jim Jacobs** and **Warren Casey**, with a special nod to the film at the end. Sperling himself has a special connection to the show: he played Eugene Florczyk – the class nerd – in a national touring company version during the early 1980s.

The film version of *Grease* has special relevance for Los Angeles audience, since it was filmed locally. The exterior school scenes were shot at Venice High, the interior scenes mostly at Huntington Park High and the carnival at Marshall High.

While it's Sperling's first version of *Grease* at Uni, it's the third time the show has been produced on campus: first in Spring 1993 – making April the 25-year anniversary of the first campus production – and again in 2009. The 2018 shows are scheduled from 18-21 April at Stivelman Theater on campus. Tickets are now on sale online *here*

Still undefeated, *Steve Ackerman*'s Wildcats have had the holidays off and will re-start their season at the Kennedy Tournament on January 2 and begin Western League play at

no. 2 Fairfax on January 8. So, Uni is 7-0 and ranked no. 9 in the SoCal Prep Insider City Section top 10! Scores:

The Wildcats are being led in scoring by 6-0 senior guard *Daisone Hughes* at 20.3 points per game, followed by soph 6-3 forward *David Cheatom* – the Whittier Tournament's Most Valuable Player – averaging 18.3 (and 6.5 rebounds per) and 6-2 senior guard *Richard Wilson Jr.* at 16.4 and a team-high 8.8 rebounds per game.

Ackerman is asking for alumni financial support for the team through a <u>GoFundMe</u> campaign. He notes that "Due to tremendous budget cuts to education in the State of California and within our school district, and further suffocating restrictions for how some funds are spent, the budget for prep athletics has been decimated.

"We need to fund-raise annually for our program just to maintain its infrastructure. Whether it is for the purchase of new uniforms, or replacement of damaged ones, new or replacement sports equipment (basketballs, athletic tape, first aid supplies, etc.), maintenance of the basketball facilities (courts, backboards, rims, nets), or entry fees for seasonal tournaments, it is an annual struggle to fund the necessities for our three teams (Varsity, J.V. & Frosh/Soph). Your help is greatly appreciated!"

## **UHEF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE**

- ▶ Did you know that the UHEF thanks to your donations supports these annual scholarships for Uni students:
  - *Community Service Scholarship*: \$1,000 awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni.
  - Jack Moskowitz Principal's Award: Named for one of Uni's most outstanding principals (1984-93), a \$1,000 award to a graduating senior selected by Uni Principal Eric Davidson for exceptional achievement and service to the school.

• Sharon Mednick Scholarship: Created in 2004 from a \$10,000 bequest left by Uni counselor Sharon Mednick, this annual \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a senior interested in a career in education.

In addition, two new scholarships are set to be inaugurated in 2017-18 with your donations:

- Coach Richard M. Kampmann Scholarship Fund: Named for Uni's late, legendary cross country and track & field coach, to be awarded by the Stimming Family in coordination with the UHEF.

### **UNI ALUMNI NOTEBOOK**

▶ In addition to being a donor of new books to the Uni Library, *Vivienne Sinclair* '50 also sent an update:

"From Uni I went on to UCLA on scholarship, graduating with a B.A. in 1954 and an M.A. in 1956 – both in Spanish. In 1957 I joined the U.S. Air Force as a second lieutenant. I retired from the Air Force as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1978 – after serving in more than eleven different places – including twice in California, Colorado, Texas and Germany.

"I had several unique assignments: In 1971 I joined the then-all-military and all-male faculty of the U.S. Air Force Academy as an assistant professor of Spanish. I was the first woman officer selected to teach there, 1971-1974, two years before female cadets entered the Academy in 1976. On my last assignment – 1976-1978 – I served in the Pentagon as Special Assistant to the Chief of A.F. Personnel for Women in the Air Force. After retiring I returned to teaching Spanish.

"My husband Leo Vuosalo and I retired to Finland in 1992 where he was doing research in his specialty, Political Science. Although I am over 80, I still volunteer to teach two language classes at Helsinki's largest Senior Center: one in English, the other in Spanish."

Wow! Congratulations on your success and thank you for your service to our nation.

The Uni family lost <u>J. Paul Bowinkel</u> '60 on December 8, at age 75, in Corona del Mar. He attended St. Paul the Apostle School in Westwood, then went to Uni and UCLA. While a Bruin, he served as a tutor in the athletic department and graduated with honors in Political Science in 1965. He was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship to teach in Italy and he did so for four years before returning to the U.S. to begin a career in financial services.

He started his career at Kidder, Peabody and finished with UBS – the same firm although after multiple mergers – after 30 years of service, in 2009. He and his wife Vicki had two children of their own and helped to raise's Vicki's daughter, Jennifer and niece Amelia. He was fluent in French and Italian and was learning German at the time of his passing. His love of travel and fine arts – his parents owned Bowinkel's Galleries – continues with his family.

Thanks to **Howard Fine** '74 for noting his passing. Our condolences to the family and friends of all of our departed Warriors (we hope its too early for departed Wildcats!).

## SIXTH PERIOD BELL

▶ With the opening of the Collins & Katz Family YMCA on December 9, the question has been asked: Who are Collins and Katz? We can tell you!

The "Collins" is <u>Jim Collins</u>, who graduated from UCLA in 1950 and enjoyed a long career in the restaurant business as a franchisee for Kentucky Fried Chicken beginning in 1960 and as the owner (and expander) of the Sizzler Family Steak House chain from 1967. Now 91 and (mostly) retired, he and his wife Carol have been generous donors to a variety of causes, especially at UCLA (where he ran track for coach Ducky Drake) and the YMCA of Metropolitan Los Angeles.

The "Katz" is the Katz Family Foundation, founded by <u>Ronald Katz</u>, the creator of the Telecredit check-reference service that was ubiquitous in the 1960s and 1970s, and then Ronald A. Katz Technology Licensing (RAKTL). Katz later concentrated on call-processing services and accumulated more than 50 patents in automated call-center technology, licensed by his RAKTL firm. He also graduated from UCLA has also been deeply involved with the UCLA Medical Center and both the Metropolitan YMCA organization and the Westside Y.
