THANKS TO YOU, UHEF DONATIONS UP 77% OVER THIS TIME LAST YEAR!

▶ Thank you! And you! And you! And ... you too!

It's a great pleasure to report that donations to the Uni Hi Education Foundation – Uni's only alumni fund-raising and support organization – are up 77% so far in the 2017-18 term vs. the same time in the 2016-17 period.

You are the difference. But we need more of you to help, perhaps with a "grad-year" donation?

That's a <u>donation</u> in the amount of the year of your graduation from Uni. If you graduated in 1950, it would be \$19.50. If you're a new graduate, \$20.17.

One family sent in a donation for \$78.51 that covered four different grad years! Clever!

That's all it takes to make a *major difference* in the education and opportunities offered to Uni students. The Uni Hi Education Foundation has raised a little more than \$1.1 million since its formation in 1985, an average of a little less than \$35,000 a year. That's not that much, but we still haven't raised that much yet in 2017-18. But we're getting closer.

We quoted these statistics the last time and need to note them again:

- There are approximately 16,906 people on the UHEF mailing list, of which 87% have NEVER donated.
- This Warriors & Wildcats Report is circulated to 6,230 subscribers, of which 98% have NEVER given.

REMEMBERING LONGTIME UNI TEACHER GABE OROZCO

There is great sadness within the Uni family as *Gabriel "Gabe" Orozco*, a Spanish teacher and soccer coach who had been at Uni since 1986, passed away late last year. From Uni principal *Eric Davidson*:

"It is with great sadness that I inform you that at approximately 5:45 p.m., December 28, 2017, our friend and colleague, Gabriel Orozco, took his last breath in our known world. Gabriel faced his death as he lived his life – with faith, hope and charity. His family and friends were with him at the end."

Orozco was diagnosed with cancer at the beginning of the 2017-18 school year. He was the third longest-serving staff member on campus, behind only Special Education teacher *Cleo Ingram* (who came to Uni in 1980) and Chemistry teacher *Kevin Paulsen* (1985).

Services were held last Friday and Saturday in Encinitas, California. Our condolences to all of Gabe's friends, family, co-workers and students.

CAR SHOW ENTHUSIAST ASKS FOR REINSTATEMENT

▶ We asked last issue about ideas to bring alumni back to campus. We received two comments, both from enthusiasts of the now-discontinued All-Classes Picnic and Car Show, last held in 2016.

Larry Smith (hollywooddog@ca.rr.com) wrote:

"I think you should bring back the Car Show and maybe substitute the Picnic with something else for the younger alumni. At least alternate years so us older alums can see some great cars.

"You should take into account that cars were a very important part of our Uni High experience. Sort of like cell phones are to students now. Something to think about since we older alums are responsible for the great legacy of University. Go Warriors!"

Smith's comments were especially poignant in that what was the main student parking lot for decades, off of Ohio Avenue, no longer exists. It has been replaced by the new (South) Gym (which has a handful of spaces in front of it) and now the Collins & Katz YMCA building!

Other ideas? We're happy to have more ideas on (1) bringing alumni back to campus, (2) promoting the UHEF and its work to support Uni and (3) raise more funds to accelerate the work of the Foundation.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR: "GREASE" OPENS ON APRIL 18

Uni's upcoming production of *Grease* is being widely anticipated on campus, as the show is one of the most popular musicals in production across the country. Although originally written in Chicago in 1971, with specific ethnic references to that city, it is best known from Paramount's <u>1978 film</u> that starred **John Travolta** and **Olivia Newton-John** as Danny Zuko and Sandy Olsson (Sandy Dumbrowski in the musical) in their senior years at fictional Rydell High School.

Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie Sperling* '76 notes that the upcoming production will reflect the *original*, *edgy musical* by *Jim Jacobs* and *Warren Casey*, with a special nod to

the film at the end. Sperling himself has a special connection to the show: he played Eugene Florczyk – the class nerd – in a national touring company version during the early 1980s.

While it's Sperling's first version of *Grease* at Uni, it's the third time the show has been produced on campus: first in Spring 1993 – making April the 25-year anniversary of the first campus production – and again in 2009. The 2018 shows are scheduled from 18-21 April at Stivelman Theater on campus. Tickets are now on sale online *here*.

The Wildcats continue to be led in scoring by 6-0 senior guard *Daisone Hughes* at 21.0 points per game, followed by soph 6-3 forward *David Cheatom* at 16.9 per game (and 6.7 rebounds per) and 6-2 senior guard *Richard Wilson Jr.* at 11.8 and a team-high 7.8 rebounds per game.

Ackerman is asking for alumni financial support for the team through a <u>GoFundMe</u> campaign. He notes that "Due to tremendous budget cuts to education in the State of California and within our school district, and further suffocating restrictions for how some funds are spent, the budget for prep athletics has been decimated.

"We need to fund-raise annually for our program just to maintain its infrastructure. Whether it is for the purchase of new uniforms, or replacement of damaged ones, new or replacement sports equipment (basketballs, athletic tape, first aid supplies, etc.),

maintenance of the basketball facilities (courts, backboards, rims, nets), or entry fees for seasonal tournaments, it is an annual struggle to fund the necessities for our three teams (Varsity, J.V. & Frosh/Soph). Your help is greatly appreciated!"

UHEF SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

- ▶ Did you know that the UHEF thanks to your donations supports these annual scholarships for Uni students:
 - *Community Service Scholarship*: \$1,000 awarded to a graduating senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni.
 - Jack Moskowitz Principal's Award: Named for one of Uni's most outstanding principals (1984-93), a \$1,000 award to a graduating senior selected by Uni Principal Eric Davidson for exceptional achievement and service to the school.
 - *Sharon Mednick Scholarship*: Created in 2004 from a \$10,000 bequest left by Uni counselor Sharon Mednick, this annual \$1,000 scholarship is awarded to a senior interested in a career in education.

In addition, two new scholarships are set to be inaugurated in 2017-18 with your donations:

- Coach Richard M. Kampmann Scholarship Fund: Named for Uni's late, legendary cross country and track & field coach, to be awarded by the Stimming Family in coordination with the UHEF.

The Uni family lost <u>Charles M. Madary, Jr.</u> on December 20 at the age of 88. He attended Emerson Junior High and Uni, then attending college at Santa Clara University and Claremont Men's College. He served in the U.S. Army after graduation and then had a lengthy career with the McDonnell Douglas Corporation and in residential real estate.

Thanks to **Howard Fine** '74 for noting his passing. Our condolences to the family and friends of all of our departed Warriors (we hope its too early for departed Wildcats!).

- The massive plaques saluting Coach *Dick Kampmann*, Uni sprinter (and double Olympic gold medalist) *Mel Patton* '43 and the school's first principal, *Angus Cavanaugh*, are mounted outside the north side of the South Gym. If you would like to see them, please note that Uni is a closed school and requires visitors to register. Please arrange your entry by calling Uni (310) 914-3500 and ask to schedule a date to come to see the plaques.
- We have received a number of inquiries about how one can obtain a copy of an old diploma or a proof of graduation. We have the answers (we think):
 - If you graduated within the past 10 years, call the Registrar's Office at Uni directly, and they can help you. Uni's telephone number is (310) 914-3500.
 - If you graduated before 2006, here's the link to the LAUSD Web page which includes instructions on how to obtain your records: http://achieve.lausd.net/transcripts. Please read the requirements carefully!

SIXTH PERIOD BELL

A blast from the past! UHEF co-president *Judy Wolfenstein* received a note from 1939 graduate *Mits Kayagowe*, who actually attended Uni for five years – from the eighth grade in 1935 through 12th, in 1939 ... the last class to graduate prior to the outbreak of World War II!

Among the highlights were memories of how the campus changed after a major earthquake:

"After the 1933 Long Beach earthquake, the main administration bldg. was unusable so the city had to import half-canvas, parklike cabins for classrooms. These were lined up on the eastern side of the school grounds at the top level alongside Barrington Ave.

"Except for rainy weather, the canvas 'windows' had to be rolled up because the cabins were almost unbearable when filled with 35-40 students and no air except from the door. However, the teachers had a rough time trying to keep order when it was warm because, if the 'windows' were rolled up, you could wave at friends as far as four 'classrooms' away!! How enjoyable were the canvas classrooms?!!!"

Uni got away lucky enough in '33 as the Administration Building was repaired; the elegant auditorium along Westgate Avenue was red-tagged and torn down after the 1971 Sylmar quake.
