UNI BOYS BASKETBALL TEAM IN CITY DIV. 1 FINAL ON MARCH 3!

▶ Coach *Steve Ackerman* and his Wildcats basketball team are having a season to remember ... and it's still going!

Uni is 25-4 and has advanced to the championship game in the Los Angeles City Division I playoffs, with the title game coming up on Saturday, March 3, at 3 p.m. at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

The Wildcats will take on George Washington Prep (a.k.a. Washington High School), which has a 22-10 mark, including a 9-3 record in the Marine League.

While Western League rivals Fairfax and Westchester made it into the City's Open Division field, Uni – third in the league behind those two – was seeded fourth in Division I. Uni crushed no. 13 Rancho Dominguez in its first game, 91-64, then squeezed by fifth-seed Carson, 63-56.

In the semis, Uni faced top-seeded View Park, but managed a 67-62 win thanks to *Nick Smith*, who had 17 points; 16 points, nine rebounds and six blocked shots from *David Cheatom*; 14 points from *Daisone Hughes* and 13 from *Richard Wilson*.

Washington, the no. 3 seed, defeated Poly, 100-58; Gardena, 65-53 and Venice, 67-41, to reach the title game.

Uni won its only All-City basketball championship in 1954, but *Jim Nakabara* led Uni to the City Invitational Division title in 2002 and Ackerman's 2008 squad also won the Invitational Division championship.

The cast of Uni's upcoming production of *Grease* is set and the show is being widely anticipated on campus. No wonder: it's one of the most popular musicals in production across the country. 

Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie Sperling* '76 notes that the upcoming production will reflect the <u>original</u>, <u>edgy musical</u> by **Jim Jacobs** and **Warren Casey**, with a special nod to the film at the end. Sperling himself has a special connection to the show: he played Eugene Florczyk – the class nerd – in a national touring company version during the early 1980s.

While it's Sperling's first version of *Grease* at Uni, it's the third time the show has been produced on campus: first in Spring 1993 – making April the 25-year anniversary of the first campus production – and again in 2009. 



★ Uni to play for City Division IV Championship on March 3 ★

The Wildcats, coached by *Antonio Vinolas*, will play for the City Division IV championship on Saturday, March 3 at Valley College at noon against top-seeded San Pedro.

Uni won its last three games to end the regular season and was seeded second in Division IV with a 12-4-5 overall record and 7-2-3 in Western League play. In the City Div. 4 playoffs, Uni has defeated L.A. CES, 5-0; Garfield, 2-1, and Legacy, 2-1, to reach the title game.

 - Jack Moskowitz Principal's Award: Named for one of Uni's most outstanding principals (1984-93), a \$1,000 award to a graduating senior selected by Uni Principal Eric Davidson for exceptional achievement and service to the school.

Booth has been running for an astonishing 73 years and has never suffered a significant injury. His book details – with text and photos – the proper running style to avoid disabling knee injuries and have more fun without pain.

- Someone has got to do a book or documentary on the Class of '58 graduation and grad night party ... you know, that one with *Frank Sinatra* and *Sammy Davis, Jr.*? More comments have come in to the UHEF site, including:
 - Ted Tanaka (tanaka@tanakaintl.com) wrote in:

"I was there, invited by S'58 Elsie Tominaga. I was a Uni Imperials of W'57, only about 165 in the class. Pali Hi site grounds were just starting to be leveled before opening in '61.

"I clearly remember the Miramar large stage with the full orchestra in the background. Front & center with the mike was headliner, Nancy's dad Frank. After he led off, he surprised the audience by introducing Sammy Davis, Jr. They sang some duets and then Sammy by himself did his famous tunes, dancing & stand-up humor. Truly a once-in-a-lifetime experience and incredible memories for the Warriors. I still frequently drive past Uni today – Westgate & Texas Ave. – from my Palisades home for the past 45-years and (also) into Sawtelle Japantown."

• Loy Harness Baxter (loy_baxter@sbcglobal.net) wanted to set the record straight:

"I was in the Class of '58 and our class was not 600 as reported by James Wartman. I think we were about 300, and I KNOW our graduation ceremony was held on the field below the grove on campus, not at UCLA Royce Hall."

It's also time for the Class of '58 to get its 60-year reunion together, isn't it? We've already had an inquiry from *Stewart Spivak* here.

And, further to our note last issue about *Elizabeth Taylor* walking with the Class of 1950, *Dorothy Steward* (*rsteward32@verizon.net*) wrote to say that "She did not attend Uni Hi; she had her education on the movie lots, but she was at our graduation and they were shooting pictures through the entire graduation, (probably just for the studio, not the Chieftain)."

Finally, *Inez Roston Gelfand* '54 (*inezgelfand@verizon.net*) wanted to note another star of the day walked with her class as well: "I do believe that *Margaret O'Brien* went through our graduating ceremony."

O'Brien, of course, was a great child star in the 1940s and was perhaps best known as the adorable Tootie in the famed 1944 film, *Meet Me in St. Louis*, starring *Judy Garland*.
