VOTE FOR UNI'S NEW NAME? A NEW CHARTER PETITION HAS BEEN FILED

▶ The proposal for Uni to become an affiliated charter school within the Los Angeles Unified School District has taken a major step forward with a new petition to the District, submitted on January 30.

The term of the proposal is for July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2023 and is available for inspection <u>here</u>. The projected enrollment for the four-grade (9-12) program would be 1,625, slightly less than Uni's current enrollment of 1,798.

Why? In a nutshell, according to the petition:

"Despite its academic, programming, community-partnership, and facility revitalization achievements, University High has experienced decreased enrollment resulting from an number of community families who have elected to send their children to nearby private, affiliated, and independent charter high schools. To better serve students in University High's feeder pattern who attend affiliated charters such as Emerson Middle School, Paul Revere Middle School and Westwood Elementary, University High has elected to become an affiliated charter, offering parents and students a premier, comprehensive, community-based school option."

The petition includes a lengthy list of goals, including increased student achievement in English and Mathematics, a decrease in absenteeism and the drop-out rate, an increase in the percentage of students meeting graduation requirements, increasing the number of students earning college credit through Advanced Placement courses and increasing parent and community involvement.

The curriculum is identified, with a conservancy program for ninth graders and a School for Advanced Studies, Math-Arts-Science-Technology (M.A.S.T.) Magnet and a wide variety of Advanced Placement courses available for grades 10-12.

The Charter will be directed by a 20-member University High School Council, which will include the school principal, 10 teachers who are members of United Teachers Los Angeles, five parent or community representatives, two student representatives, one non-faculty staff member and one at-large member. The Council will be the primary overseer of school funds.

One of the changes will likely be a new name for the school, such as "University Charter High School" or "University High School a Community Charter" or something else. You can vote for your favorite by linking to the ballot *here*.

The Affiliated Charter proposal is a serious effort by the Uni administration and faculty to address the significant reduction in attendance at the school over the past several years and is critical to Uni's future. If you are interested in a snapshot of Uni in 2018, the 103-page Charter proposal is a worthwhile – and eye-opening – read.

UNI BOYS BASKETBALL TEAM FINISHES SECOND IN CITY DIV. 1

Uni's 2017-18 boys basketball team will long be remembered for an outstanding season that ended with a 26-6 record and a second-place finish in the City Division 1 playoffs.

Coach *Steve Ackerman's* squad was 23-4 in the regular season, losing only to City champion Westchester and runner-up Fairfax, both of whom happened to be in the Western League.

Uni was seeded fourth in the Division I playoffs and reached the final against third-seeded Washington Prep on March 3 at Cal State Dominguez Hills. The game was a classic, with Uni

sprinting to a 34-24 halftime lead, but the Generals clawed their way back into the game, narrowing the lead to 44-41 at the end of three quarters.

Washington finally got the lead at 52-50 with 3:13 to play in the game and held on for a 60-58 win and the Division I championship.

Senior guard *Richard Wilson* led Uni with 16 points on 7-of-13 shooting from the floor, while senior guard *Daisone Hughes* and soph forward *David Cheatom* each had 13. While the Wildcats shot 48.1% from the field, Uni made only 6-16 free throws (37.5%) and was outrebounded, 36-31.

As the runner-up in City Division I, Uni qualified and was seeded second in the California State Division III tournament, opening with a home game against Reedley Immanuel. Uni piled up a 44-23 lead by halftime and cruised home with an 86-60 win, thanks to 33 points from Hughes and 20 from Cheatom.

In the regional quarterfinals, Uni hosted Bishop Amat (27-6) on March 10. The Lancers raced out to a 38-21 halftime lead, but the Wildcats fought back with a 22-13 edge in the third quarter to close to 51-43 at the end of three quarters. In the fourth, Uni got to within two points at 55-53, but that was as close as they got. Bishop Amat held on for a 66-59 win and advanced to the regional semis.

Cheatom led Uni with 19 points and Hughes had 18, but the Wildcats shot only 30.9% from the field (17-55), but did make 15-19 free throws.

(What happened to Washington? Top-seeded in Division III, they also lost in the regional quarters, to Notre Dame, 73-70, at home.)


The loss ended a great season for Uni, but one to be proud of. It's the second straight season with 20 or more wins for Uni and the Wildcats compiled a two-year record of 47-16. Congratulations.

Uni's top scorer for the season was 6-0 senior guard *Daisone Hughes*, who averaged 20.1 points per game. Soph 6-3 forward *David Cheatom* averaged 17.4 per game (and 8.0 rebounds per) and 6-2 senior guard *Richard Wilson Jr.* contributed 12.6 and a teamhigh 8.6 rebounds per game.

Hughes was honored by being named to the All-Los Angeles City third team by SoCal Prep Insider and he, Cheatom and Wilson were all named to the All-Western League First Team.

Uni's 26 wins set a school record and the 2017-18 Wildcats also won only the second State Tournament game in the school's history!

Ackerman commented, "This season was magical for so many reasons highlighted by our amazing win-loss record, our strong finish in league play, our recognition & notoriety by the Southern California print & online media, our high seeds in the L.A. City Section and California State Playoffs, and the well-deserved, post season All League honors for six members of the Varsity Team. I'm glad so many students, parents, faculty, and UNI alumni got to enjoy the ride right along with us."

SIXTH PERIOD BELL

No end to the comments about celebrities who went to Uni, especially during the heyday of the Hollywood studio system, when Uni was often the preferred high school for graduation of studio-taught, contract-player teenagers. *Louise (Kosches) Iscoe* '46 (*lkiscoe@gmail.com*) remembered:

"After so many years (1946), I have fun looking back on Uni and reading your newsletter. When I read about the stars who attended graduation, I thought about my graduation. One day, at a rehearsal, the door opened and six young starlets and one boy walked in. I have no idea about the young ladies, as far as I know never heard of again. But the boy, known at the time and for many years afterward, was **Roddy**McDowell. We real graduates were quite incensed that at the graduation ceremony, he got the greatest applause."
