SENIOR AWARDS DAY: UNI RECOGNIZES SENIORS & UHEF AWARDS 4 SCHOLARSHIPS

▶ Uni's annual evening of senior honors took place on May 23, with awards distributed by 25 departments and scholarships and special-recognition awards made to multiple outstanding students.

Included in this program were four awards provided by, or coordinated through, the Uni Hi Education Foundation. These included:

- UHEF COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD, to a senior who has shown exceptional dedication to community service during their tenure at Uni, awarded this year to *Chris Park*. He wrote movingly about his experiences at the South L.A. Animal Shelter and informing the Student Advocacy Club on campus. He will be attending UC San Diego in the fall.
- SHARON MEDNICK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP, created by a bequest from the late Uni counselor and awarded to a senior interested in a career in education. *Alexa Pascual* is this year's recipient; she overcame a traumatic bullying incident to later become Student Body President, and attending Western Justice Invitationals to help bring attention to the problem of bullying. She will also attend UC San Diego.
- JACK MOSKOWITZ PRINCIPAL AWARD, created in honor of the Uni principal who helped found the UHEF, and selected by current Uni principal *Eric Davidson*, honoring exceptional achievement and service to the school. This year's recipients are *Cameron Rogers* and *Kingsley Onwudiwe*.

For 2018, the **COACH RICHARD KAMPMANN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** was presented for the first time, in honor of Uni's greatest coach, who passed away last year. Nominated by Uni's head cross country and track & field coach *Kelly Aguda* and presented by Coach Kampmann's son, *Bill Stimming*, the first recipient is *Jack Koscheka*.

Noted Aguda, "He ran track and cross country for four years. He was captain of Cross Country in his senior year. He never missed a day of practice, and was always the first guy there. Always encourages others, never a derogatory word. He moved to varsity for Cross Country his freshman year for City Finals. He had over a 4.0 grade-point average."

▶ It's the high school awards season, so why not have an awards program for Uni Theatre?

Uni's Director of Theatre Arts, *Ronnie Sperling* '76, made that a reality in 2018, with the first-ever Uni High Thespian Awards. Awarded on May 22, the actors and technical staff voted for male and female awardees in 23 categories, which ranged from the serious to the quite silly, such as "Best Hugger," Biggest Slob" and "Best Shoulder to Cry on."

In the more traditional categories, the winners included:

In addition, Uni scored a second nomination for the JERRY HERMAN AWARDS, the top honor for high school theater in California. Uni's Shelton was already nominated in the category of Lead Actress for her performance as Logainne Swartzandgrubenierre in "*The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee.*"

In the category of Best Supporting Actress, *Roscoe Upton* was nominated for her performance as Donna Panch in "*The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*" as well.

The 2018 JERRY HERMAN AWARDS will be distributed at The Ricardo Montalban Theatre in Hollywood and hosted by KABC-7 reporter *George Pennacchio* on June 3.

Sperling shared that this is Uni's second entry in the seven years of these awards. At the very first ceremony in 2012, Uni's *Evyn Mirasol* won for Best Leading Actress. She then went to New York to compete in the National High School Awards – The Jimmy Awards – where she won second prize.

Folsoi adds that in the latest donations, "We were able to add to our outdated poetry section with poets relevant to today's students. In addition, these donations add books on filmmaking to support our students in digital media classes.

"Also included in the donations were books written by and about people with autism, who, according to recent statistics cited in a CBS online article, are now being born at a rate of 1 in 47. Building a collection that is inclusive and addresses the experiences of the segment of our society is very important. I appreciate all the donations that help us reflect the interests and realities of our many students.

"We also received a grant from United Talent Agency, which enabled us to update areas of our collection like the geography section, which had decades-old books on countries, some of which have long since changed names and borders. They also supported our book club by purchasing multiple copies of books for next year's reads."

ON CAMPUS

▶ As technology progresses, so does its spread through schools. Starting in the fall, every Uni student will be issued a laptop computer – either a standard-style laptop or a Chromebook!

Distribution will be made at registration on August 8-9, and – of course – it comes with plenty of strings attached, including an <u>agreement</u> for use. Users have to keep track of the device, acknowledge that it will be monitored, "not mark, draw, write or place unapproved stickers" on it or attempt to repair it. There is also an express prohibition on using the device "in any harassment or acts of intimidation (cyber-bullying) in an attempt to harm other people" using the device.

Technology marches on; it's going to be a wild two days in August with more than 1,600 computers being distributed!

Please arrange your entry by calling Uni (310) 914-3500 and ask to schedule a date to come to see the plaques.
- ▶ We have received a number of inquiries about how one can obtain a copy of an old diploma or a proof of graduation. We have the answers (we think):
 - If you graduated within the past 10 years, call the Registrar's Office at Uni directly, and they can help you. Uni's telephone number is (310) 914-3500.
 - If you graduated before 2006, here's the link to the LAUSD Web page which includes instructions on how to
 obtain your records: <u>http://achieve.lausd.net/transcripts</u>. Please read the requirements carefully!

The year of 1968 was one of massive changes and turbulence in America, with the Cold War and the Vietnam War both going strong, wild swings in politics, devastating violence in our cities and against civic and political figures like *Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.* and Sen. *Robert F. Kennedy*.

What was the environment at Uni 50 years ago this spring? From the 1968 *Chieftain*, this from Fall (1967) Student Body President *Dave Simmonds*:

"Uni is a fine school, but it is still far from perfect. The day that Uni becomes a perfect school, there will be no need to promote school spirit or to have clean campus drives. The biggest problem at Uni is apathy on the part of many students. To get something out of Uni, each student must put forth an effort."

Spring '68 semester Student Body President *Dan Hirsch* wrote that Simmonds's hope for more involvement actually came true:

"We especially stressed 'involvement,' and you responded by getting involved, some of you for the first time since you came to Uni. We asked for your increased participation in our school paper, and you responded by writing more letters-to-the-editor than ever before and helping considerably to make the <u>Warrior</u> into a true student paper.

"We asked for increased spirit, and you responded by, for example, packing the gym in record numbers for our gymnastics meet against Bell and by bringing two or three times more rooters than Pali had when we went to Pali for the track showdown.

"We asked for increased turnouts at our activities, and you responded by making our sports nights and special events like the Dating Game and the 'Heat of the Night' more successful than any activities we have ever had.

"We asked you to make this semester financially successful to make up for the losses of previous semesters, and you responded by beating Pali in WAC [Warrior Athletic Card] sales for the first time in our history and by making our magazine drive and our other money making activities extremely successful.

"We asked for your interest in our speakers and discussion programs, and you responded by showing up in large numbers to hear Allan Cranston and Dan Moore and Dr. Faber and to discuss the [military] draft and Mexican-American problems at Uni."

Was that really 50 years ago? Much has changed, but that was Uni in the late 1960s. You can check out the '68 *Chieftain* and Uni's yearbooks online for free on the UHEF's Web site <u>here</u>.
