MUSIC AT UNI

Uni was featured on the Los Angeles Unified School District website with the following write up and an inspiring photograph of our music teacher, Micah Byers, conducting the orchestra.

“From the Golden Age of Hollywood to the cutting edge trends in digital media and music, Los Angeles has long been viewed as the entertainment capital of the world. Many L.A. Unified educators have worked hard for years to capitalize on this fact, providing unique and inspiring opportunities for students.

University Charter High School is launching a new Uni Music Mentors program, partnering with composers and songwriters in the film and television industries. Students will receive hours of one-on-one private lessons from the professional musicians as well as the chance to work with them directly in recording studios. Students at Uni High today are poised to be the next generation of Emmy and Oscar winners in the years to come.”

Mr. Byers was previously tasked with archiving music at Cal State University Northridge, where he digitized material that had previously been available only in analog formats. He is currently working with the librarian at Uni to update the library’s collection of musical scores that he wishes to have available to his AP Music Theory students. At the present time, the library only has one musical score, the score for Hamilton, which was purchased for the library by Ruth Roberts, Class of 1964. WARRIORS AND WILDCATS IN ACTION

Uni hosted its first tour for prospective students and parents for the class of 2023 on September 27th. Jay Manning, parent of a Wildcat due to graduate in 2021, was the first parent to join forces with our staff and students in leading the tour. On next month’s tour, another parent, Carl Libson, will join Jay to spread the word about Uni to our next group of freshmen.

UNI WILDCATS OUTPERFORM GLOBAL AVERAGE ON AP CS A

Uni students who took the AP Computer Science A exam in Spring 2018 earned an average AP score of 3.8 out of a possible 5, with six Wildcats earning a 5 and a few beginning CS or CS-related majors in college. Uni's computer science program is extending to more than just the Advanced Placement level. A course we are now offering to three periods of students, Exploring Computer Science, was researched and designed to promote equity and deep understanding for anyone who takes it, regardless of previous academic experience and whether they wish to pursue advanced computer science courses. The class incorporates a range of critical thinking skills and creativity, as students will learn not only programming and web design but also the context in which these tools are used. In fact, the problem solving, ethical debate, acting out of algorithms, and design skill draw connections between other subjects students are studying. In order to create the exact design she wanted, one student stayed after school for more than 90 minutes essentially practicing coordinates of points, lines, and geometric shapes. Last year, some of the money from filming at Uni was used to purchase 24 new, high-performance computers. In addition to the introductory CS experience, this improved technology is also supporting several students in independently learning and preparing for the AP Computer Science Principles exam and portfolio. –Ms. Katherine Wittig


UNI ALUMNI NOTEBOOK

- Howard Fine notified of us the passing of Virginia Ann Henninger, September 9, 1958 - August 27, 2018. The following obituary appeared in the Los Angeles Times in early September. She was born September 9th, 1958 in San Diego, California, and passed away peacefully in her sleep on Monday, August 27th after succumbing to cancer. 'Ginny' spent her formative years in Los Angeles with her parents Virgil and Jean Wall, siblings David, Chris and Cathy Wall. She attended school at Bellagio Elementary, Emerson Junior High, and University High School. After high school, Ginny moved back to her birthplace county of San Diego where she received an AA degree from Palomar College and enjoyed the beach life in the communities of Del Mar and Solana Beach for the next twenty years. Ginny moved to the Pacific Northwest in 1988 settling in the Kirkland area of Seattle, after visiting the San Juan Islands on a vacation she fell in love with the beauty and tranquility of the islands and took up residence on Lopez Island where she married and raised her son Christopher Henninger. This advertisement in the Friday March 4, 1932 edition for the next week’s showings caught my eye. If you were curious how much a double feature at the Nuart Theatre would have set you back in 1932, the answer can be found in this old issue of “The Warrior.”

Charlie Chan's Chance -- played by Warner Oland, a native of Sweden but revered in the role of a Chinese detective. Considered offensive today due to the use of a non-Asian cast, the film

featured Chan, who was the smartest, wisest and funniest character in his films. Author Earl

Derr Biggers purposely created him to counter Yellow Peril stereotypes. However, it is still a reflection of a time that had a profound lack of sensitivity to other cultures. Sidney Toler carried on the role when Oland died in 1938.

The Guardsman - Feuding actors trade insults on stage and suspect each other of infidelities in this adaptation of a Ferenc Molnar comedy farce. MGM's high-toned, glossy film is a showcase for the famed theatrical acting team of Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne, the darlings of Broadway.

The Mad Genius -- another acting showcase, this one for John Barrymore as a puppeteer who trains a boy to be a famous dancer, only to see the boy win the woman he loves (Marian Marsh). Directed by Michael Curtiz, of Casablanca fame.

Taxi is a rousing tale for James Cagney, a typical Warners story of independent New York taxi drivers resisting strong-arm tactics by a company that wants to control the business. The answer, of course, is a union! Loretta Young co-stars. This is also the film where Cagney actually says, 'You dirty rat!'

One Man Law. Buck Jones was just one of scores of cowboy stars with their own series of short (usually one hour) western adventures. An ex-Marine, cowboy work led to horse shows and finally stunt work in Hollywood during the teens. One of the biggest stars of the 20s along with cowboy heroes Ken Maynard and Hoot Gibson, Buck was working for much less money at Columbia when he did One Man Law.

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
